TREASURES REPORT



Below is the status of Lodge Finances reported at the Regular Scheduled Meeting held on July 17, 2024.

CASH on HAND in the Lodge Working Checking Account at Old Point National Bank is \$40,641.35.

SAVINGS ACCOUNT - interest bearing at Langley Federal Credit Union is \$37,776.79.

INVESTMENT ACCOUNTS (Certificates of Deposits & interest bearing accounts) held at Old Point National Bank & Langley Federal Credit Union is \$244,181.77.

GAMING ACCOUNTS for gaming machines earnings is \$11,369.26.

TOTAL OF BALANCES ON HAND reported at the Lodge Meeting was \$333,969.17.

The Lodge building is paid for & valued and insured for at \$625,000.00. Personal property (contents of the building) contained within is valued and insured at \$228,000.00. The Lodge

has NO debts other than the reoccurring monthly, quarterly and annual operational expenses.

A list of the regular Lodge Operational Bills are posted on the Official Lodge Bulletin (Notice) Board. The monthly or currently due charges from that list are paid when due under the By-Laws and are presented to Members at each Regular Scheduled Lodge Meeting to review and approve the payments.

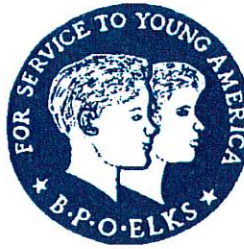

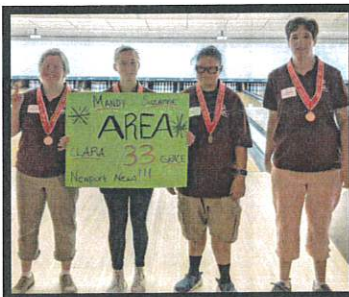

RECIPE of the MONTH

FIESTA SMOTHERED CHICKEN



- 3 tablespoons reduced-sodium soy sauce
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder
- 2 boneless skinless chicken breast halves (5 ounces each)
- 1/2 cup sliced fresh mushrooms
- 1/4 cup chopped onion
- 4 teaspoons chopped seeded jalapeno pepper
- 6 teaspoons butter, divided
- 1/4 cup shredded pepper jack cheese
- 1/4 cup shredded cheddar cheese



1. In a large shallow dish, combine the soy sauce, Worcestershire sauce and garlic powder; add the chicken. Turn to coat; set aside.
2. In a large nonstick skillet, saute the mushrooms, onion and jalapeno in 2 teaspoons butter until tender. Remove and keep warm.
3. Drain chicken, discarding marinade. In the same skillet, cook chicken in remaining butter over medium heat for 4-5 minutes on each side or until a thermometer reads 170°. Spoon vegetable mixture over each chicken breast; sprinkle with cheeses. Cover and cook for 1-2 minutes or until cheese is melted.
