This makes us eligible for a Beacon Grant of \$2,000.00 and the Lodge Grant Coordinator, Vicki Andrews, will submit the application in July.

The Veterans Committee had planned a "Pizza Party" for the Wounded Warriors Project at Fort Eustis for May 31st but because of a bureaucratic application process we were not able to do it. Our application is pending and may be approved within 90 days! I personally feel and many of you do also, that something is seriously wrong when well paid civil servants make it very hard for us to do something to help our Veterans! Our Veterans Committee will continue to resolve this and other issues impeding our efforts to **SUPPORT OUR VETERANS!** The Committee will also have a fund raising dinner in July (see ad on page). Also, please help the Committee in their effort to collect DVR's for the Veterans.

I will be attending the 150th Annual Grand Lodge Session (Convention) in New Orleans, Louisiana, from July 13th to the 17th. One of the things I will participate in is the consideration of proposed resolutions to change the "Laws of the Order". This year there are only a total of eleven proposals, three from individual Lodges and eight from State Associations (last year there were a total of 22). The three proposals from Lodges all pertain to the scheduling and frequency of Lodge Meetings. None of these would cause a change to our Lodge By-Laws; therefore I will vote "YES" to these three proposals. The following are proposals from state associations:

Proposal #1 - "All Officers shall memorize the Opening and Closing and Initiatory Rituals for their respective station within 60 days after their installation. Failure to do so may require a forfeiture of office". I feel that in a small Lodge that this is very restrictive and while I would like my officers to memorize their parts, I feel that if a part is read well, all will be satisfied. I am leaning toward a "NO" vote on this. Proposals # 2 & # 3 would allow a Lodge to change it's By-Laws to charge an annual assessment (a fee) or charge for the use of Club facilities. While I do not envision our Lodge ever charging fees to use our Home Club or Lodge Facilities for Members, some Lodges may need to do this to survive; therefore, I will vote "YES" on this. Proposals # 4, # 5 & # 6 all relate to a Lodge having a requirement to have a Public Relations Committee. I appointed such a Committee for our Lodge this year and the next time we revise our By-Laws we will add it as a mandatory committee, I will vote "YES" on this. Proposal # 7 allows a Lodge in El Paso, Texas to be a member of the New Mexico State Association. Look at map of Texas and that makes sense, I will vote "YES" on this. Proposal # 8 involves procedures set forth for handling problems associated with actions to suspend members from the Lodge or from the social areas of the Lodge. This change adds procedures if respondents are Lodge Officers or members of the supervising or managing body (Home Club in our case). These are technical changes and I will vote "YES" on this.

If you have any concerns about how I plan to vote on the above issues please contact me and I will be glad to discuss it with you. The above Proposals were current as of the date of this publication of the letter and I do not expect any changes. I will report to the Lodge at the August 20th (continued on page 3, left column)

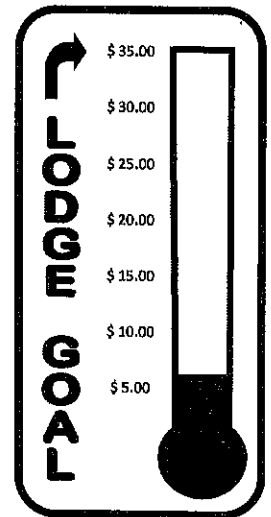
FROM the ELKS NATIONAL FOUNDATION COMMITTEE

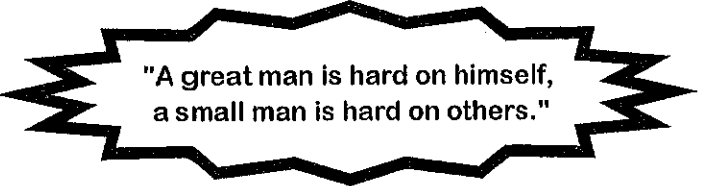

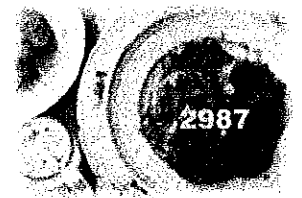

RECIPE of the MONTH

Fried Green Tomatoes

4 green tomatoes, cut into ¼ inch rings
 Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
 ¾ cup all-purpose flour
 1 tablespoon garlic powder
 4 eggs
 2 tablespoons milk
 1 ½ cups panko bread crumbs
 Pinch cayenne pepper
 Pinch paprika



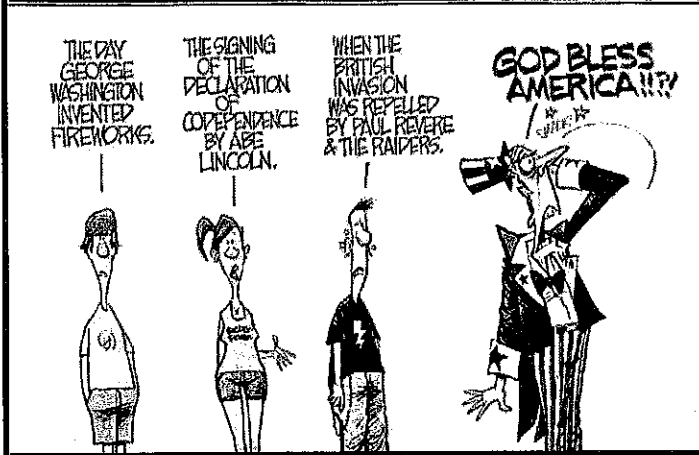
In a deep-fryer, preheat oil to 350 degrees F. Season tomatoes, on both sides, with salt and pepper. Place flour and garlic powder in a shallow dish. In another shallow dish, beat eggs with the milk. In another dish, mix bread crumbs with cayenne and paprika. Dredge tomatoes through the flour, then the eggs, and then through the bread crumbs. Add only a few pieces to the fryer at a time, so they can cook evenly, about 2 to 3 minutes. Drain on paper towels and serve with Buttermilk Dipping Sauce.

Buttermilk Dipping Sauce

1 cup apple cider
 1 tablespoon brown sugar
 ¾ cup mayonnaise
 Juice from 1 lime
 3 scallions, thinly sliced
 ¾ cup buttermilk
 2 tablespoons Neely's BBQ sauce

In a small saucepan over medium heat, combine the apple cider and brown sugar. Allow to reduce until thick and syrupy. Remove from heat and allow to cool. In a medium bowl, add buttermilk, mayonnaise, BBQ sauce and lime juice and whisk well. Add in the scallions and the apple cider mixture. Cover and refrigerate until ready to serve.

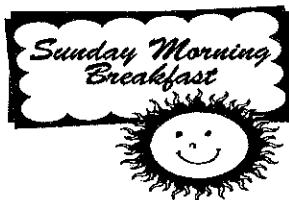
