**RESOLUTIONS PRESENTED & VOTING RESULTS**  
**Grand Lodge Session, New Orleans, La — July 2014**

1. To change the office of Grand Tiler from an elective to an appointed position. (PASSED)
2. To allow a Lodge in Texas to become a member of the New Mexico Elks Association with the concurrence of the Sponsors of both states. (PASSED)
3. To authorize a Lodge to require its officers to memorize the Opening, Closing and Initiatory rituals under penalty of removal from office. (FAILED)
4. To authorize a Lodge through a By-Law provision to impose an annual assessment on its members to be applied toward the use of specified club Facilities. (FAILED)
5. To authorize a Lodge through a By-Law provision to impose assessment on its members to be applied toward the use of specified club facilities. (FAILED)
6. To reinstate the Grand Lodge and Local Lodge Public Relations Committees. (PASSED)
7. To limit the authority of an Exalted Ruler who is the subject of a club suspension proceeding. (PASSED)
8. To allow a Local Lodge Mediator to hear from witnesses during mediation sessions. (PASSED)
9. To eliminate the Grand Lodge Government Committee and reassign its duties to the Activities Committee. (FAILED)
10. To change the office of Lodge Tiler from an elective position to an appointed position. (PASSED)
11. To define "Restricted Funds" under the Laws of the Order. (PASSED)
12. To limit a Lodge's ability to disburse or borrow against Restricted Funds in a manner which is contrary to the restricted purpose. (PASSED)
13. To allow the governing body of the Home, Club or other facility to suspend or revoke club privileges of a visiting Member without the requirement of a club suspension hearing. (FAILED)
14. To clarify the time frames within which action is to be taken by a Presiding Justice as part of a Local Forum proceeding. (PASSED)
15. To allow a vote to be taken by secret ballot instead of the voting sign of an Elk by a majority vote of the Lodge. (PASSED)
16. To facilitate the timely collection of membership statistics by the Grand Secretary's Office, leaving the process of charity reporting and dues payment unchanged. (PASSED)
17. To increase the number of officers who may serve as alternate check signers and the amount of any authorized Club supplies account. (PASSED)
18. To amend and clarify the procedure to drop a Member from the Lodge membership rolls for indebtedness to the Lodge. (PASSED)
19. To authorize the appointment of multiple Presiding Justices and/or Mediators as needed. (PASSED)
20. To allow a Lodge to hold regular Lodge meetings monthly, semi-monthly, tri-monthly or weekly as provided by approved Lodge By-laws. (FAILED)
21. To revise the timetable of nominations for Officers in the event resolution 2014-20 is confirmed. (FAILED)
22. To revise the annual election of Officers in the event resolution 2014-20 is confirmed. (FAILED)

If any Member has questions about the above please talk to me and I will share with you any information I have. I do not think that any of the above will require us to modify our By-Laws at this time.

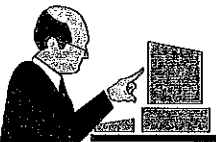

**SECRETARY'S NOTES**

**MEMBERSHIP – BACK TO BASICS**



**New Members:** A person who has never been an Elk must fill out an Application for Membership and pay the membership fee of \$25.00. A current Elk must be the sponsor of the candidate, and the application

must contain the names of two Elks, other than the sponsor, as references. If the candidate does not get initiated within four months of applying, the application is voided.

**Transfers:** An Elk in good standing in another Lodge may apply for transfer into our Lodge by completing an Application for Affiliation and paying the affiliation fee of \$25.00. The applicant for transfer must also complete a Request for Transfer Demit to be submitted to the Secretary of the Elk's current Lodge.

An Elk not in good standing in any Lodge may apply for transfer into our Lodge by completing an Application for Affiliation and paying the affiliation fee of \$25.00. The applicant for transfer must also complete a Request for a Certificate of Release to be submitted to the Secretary of the Elk's former Lodge and pay a fee of \$20.00 to that Lodge.

**RECIPE of the MONTH**

*Crispy Lemon Catfish*

- Vegetable oil
- 1 cup instant potato flakes
- 1/2 teaspoon loosely packed lemon zest
- 4 (4-oz.) catfish fillets
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/2 teaspoon black pepper
- 3/4 cup milk



Pour oil to depth of 1 inch into a large deep skillet; heat to 350°. Stir together potato flakes and lemon zest. Sprinkle catfish with salt and pepper. Dip catfish in milk; dredge in potato flake mixture, pressing gently to adhere. Fry catfish, in batches, 3 to 5 minutes on each side or until golden brown and fish just flakes with a fork. Drain on a wire rack over paper towels. Serve with Marinated Slaw. (see below)

- 1 (16-oz.) package shredded coleslaw mix
- 1 1/2 cups fresh corn kernels (about 3 ears)
- 2 cucumbers, sliced into half-moons
- 1/2 cup chopped fresh cilantro
- 1 cup jarred mild banana pepper rings, drained
- 2 garlic cloves, minced & 1 cup rice vinegar
- 1 tablespoon sugar & 1 1/2 teaspoons kosher salt
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1/2 teaspoon dried crushed red pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon black pepper & 1/2 cup mayonnaise



Combine coleslaw mix, corn kernels, cucumbers, cilantro, banana pepper rings, and garlic in a large zip-top plastic freezer bag. Whisk together vinegar, sugar, kosher salt, cumin, crushed red pepper, and black pepper; add to bag. Seal bag, and turn to coat. Let stand 30 minutes. Drain; transfer to a serving bowl. Stir in mayonnaise to coat.

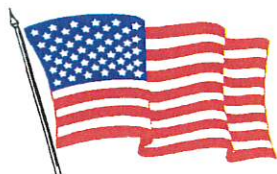
