I am aware of consternation among some Members and their spousal guests of our Lodge about the operation of the *Home Club* (Lounge, Bar or whatever you choose to call it). First, I will remind you that the purpose of our Lodge existence is NOT to provide a *cheap place for people to consume alcoholic beverages*. If the only reason you became an Elk was to find a cheap place to drink, then you are probably in the wrong place. For Members, remember the content of the "Solemn and Binding Obligation" you swore to during your Initiation and the Principals of Our Order that was explained to you. If you enjoy your access to the social part of our Lodge as a spouse you need to ask your Member sponsor about those Principals. Having said that, I will elaborate on issues that have been brought to my attention; but, first I must remind all that we (The Lodge) are subject to Virginia Law and ABC regulations and failure to comply with these can result in the revocation of our ability (License) to serve alcoholic beverages. (1) Under ABC regulations only designated ABC managers or bar tenders on duty can dispense alcoholic beverages on our premises. (2) Prices are set to cover the cost of labor and other overhead costs of the Home Club. Bar tenders are not allowed to deviate from prices set. (3) Published hours of operation shall be adhered to. (4) The dues you pay to be a Member do not, repeat, do not in any way support the HOME CLUB. The dues support the *FRATERNAL FUNCTIONS* of the Lodge and the Order of Elks. Again, DUES DO NOT subsidize the operating cost of the Home Club and are not factored into the prices charged for alcoholic beverages. (5) If you have a problem in the Home Club, put it in writing and leave it in the Secretary's box by the front door. I will review complaints and see that issues are dealt with. Complaining to a bar tender may *not* result in any corrective action! Lodge business is conducted at Lodge meetings and NOT in the Home Club. A member may also attend a Home Club House Committee Meeting to make suggestions. I have ordered posted in the Home Club a price list for alcoholic beverages and the rules for serving them. Arguing with a bar tender over your "tab" can result in a pay as you are served policy. Overall our prices are significantly less than what can be found in commercial establishments in our area. Our prices are set based on our overhead and we do not try to compete with other fraternal organizations. Protect what you have as a Member.

I would like to thank Michelle Waddell for covering several Chairs during recent Lodge Meetings when other Officers could not attend.

I wish all Members a happy and safe Holiday season and hope you will enjoy our Lodge events.

Marcia and I wish all Elks and families a Merry Christmas and Happy and Prosperous New Year.

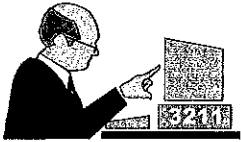
JOHN D. AMEN - GRAND EXALTED RULER

FROM the ELKS NATIONAL FOUNDATION COMMITTEE

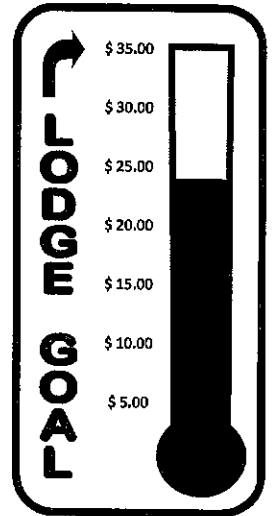

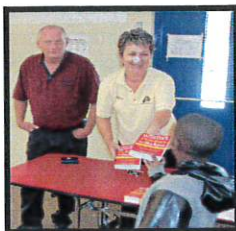


THE DICTIONARY PROGRAM

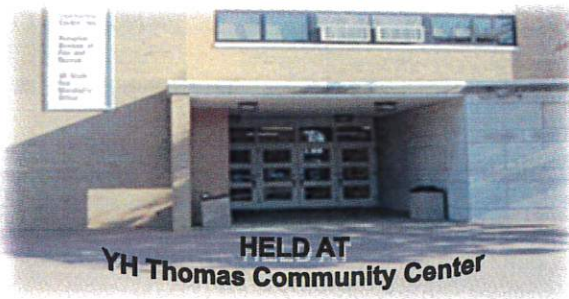

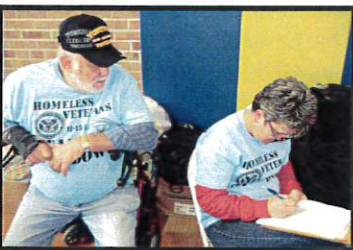
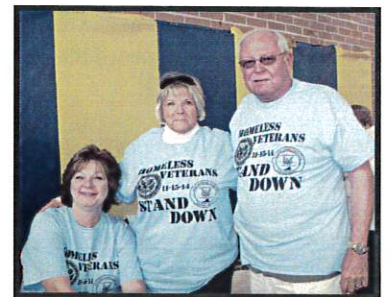

CAKE

- 1 box Duncan Hines yellow cake mix
- ¾ cup water
- 1 (6 ounce) instant chocolate pudding
- 1 cup Wesson oil
- 4 eggs

Mix cake mix, pudding, eggs, water, and oil. Bake in greased Bundt pan for 55 to 60 minutes at 350 °.

GLAZE

- ¼ cup Kailua
- ½ cup Powdered sugar

Mix Kailua with powdered sugar. Turn cake out of pan and pour glaze over top. Let dribble down the sides.


