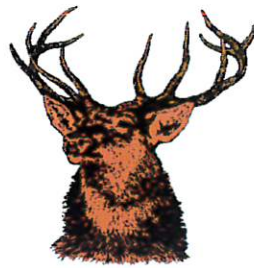

importantly having the time to attend meetings and perform the duties required of the Office shall be considered. I will be available to any member desiring to seek an Office to discuss what will be expected of them if elected to an Office in the Lodge. Just for Members information I plan to be a candidate for reelection as the Lodge Exalted Ruler for the 2015 - 2016 Lodge Year.

The Lodge Year for 2014 - 2015 does not end until March 31, 2015 and we as a Lodge have a lot to accomplish in the last three months of this year. Having said that, I will once again discuss Membership with you. Some potential candidates have asked why are the dues so high? Let's look at that - Dues currently total \$97.00 per year and are broken out as follows: \$16.00 is a Grand Lodge per capita fee and an insurance assessment plus Virginia Elks Association dues are \$3.00 and the remaining \$78.00 goes to our Lodge. So how much are your Dues? They equal 27¢ per day, \$8.08 per month and \$97.00 per year? WOW, that's a Deal! However; the Board of Trustees reviewed the dues cost within the context of the overall financial position of the Lodge and determined that Lodge retained portion could be lowered. This action will bring our dues in line with other Fraternal Organizations in our area when the consideration of our hours of operation and the cost of overhead are taken into account. However, recruiting a new member is not driven by the cost of dues, it is about "ELKEDOM". We stand on what we are: good people doing charity, supporting Veterans, active in our community, sponsoring youth programs, helping those in need and supporting each other as Members and social activates too. Ask a friend, a neighbor, a business associate or acquaintance, a church member or just someone you know to join. Bring them to a Lodge event and show them that we are a great place to share in fellowship. Use the recruiting brochure available by the Lodge front door to help you explain details about our Lodge. The Goal I set for this Lodge Year was 30 new Members, well, with three months to go we are only at 34% of that goal. **MEMBERSHIP IS THE LIFEBLOOD OF OUR LODGE.** *Recruit a new Member today. I know you can - so do IT!*

Let's all resolve to boost Lodge membership

It is the start of a new calendar year, and now is the time to make a personal resolution regarding your Lodge Membership situation. Resolve to call upon all Members to help improve Lodge membership numbers because membership is our number one issue. Resolve to work these final months of the Lodge year for a plus membership year in your Lodge. Resolve to act now!

Lodge Secretaries and Exalted Rulers: Do not go it alone - ask for help from your key Members. Enlist the help of your Past Exalted Rulers Association. Additionally, you should engage the Proposers of delinquent Members to call on their initiates.

All local delinquent Members should receive a personal visit from a key Lodge Member. This will enable Lodge officials to determine if the delinquent Member is sick or in distress and should be the subject of a review by the Lodge Standing Relief Committee. The pride of distressed Members will often prevent them from talking about their situation on the phone. You know the Grand Lodge and State Association dues and per capitas have already been paid by the Lodge, and if you allow the Member to be dropped from the rolls then you will have gained nothing this year.

Special consideration should be given to delinquent Members who have attained Life Member status. These Members have paid at least 30 years of dues and may be in a situation where family members are making financial decisions for the Member. It is a shame to coldly drop these long-standing Members who may well be incapable of making their own financial decisions. Again, face-to-face visits with a delinquent Member is imperative.

Form a committee to call upon Members who have been dropped from the rolls the past five years, and remind them of the good works your Lodge does in your community. Let's all pull together to get the Plus 1 status for the Lodge and for the Order.

### **NOTICE OF MOTIONS TO AMEND THE LODGE BYLAWS TO REDUCE THE REGULAR DUES OF THE LODGE AND TO REDUCE THE FEE FOR LIFE MEMBERSHIP**

The following Motions were presented at the regular Lodge meeting held on Wednesday, December 17, 2014. The Exalted Ruler ordered that a vote shall be taken on these motions at the regular meeting to be held on Wednesday, January 7, 2014. The motions are set out fully below:

#### **MOTION TO AMEND THE BYLAWS TO REDUCE THE REGULAR LODGE DUES FROM \$78.00 TO \$60.00 PER YEAR**

Move that Article X, Fees and Dues, Section 2, subsection (c) of the Bylaws, which reads as follows:

(c) The regular Lodge dues shall be \$78.00 per year.

*be amended to read as follows:*

(c) The regular Lodge dues shall be \$60.00 per year.

#### **MOTION TO AMEND THE BYLAWS TO REDUCE THE FEE FOR LIFE MEMBERSHIP FROM \$1,950.00 TO \$1,500.00**

Move that Article III, Life Membership, Section 1 of the Bylaws, which reads as follows:

Section 1. The Lodge, by an affirmative secret ballot of two-thirds of those present at a regular Lodge meeting, may elect a member in good standing to Life Membership upon the payment in advance of \$1,950.00.

*be amended to read as follows:*

Section 1. The Lodge, by an affirmative secret ballot of two-thirds of those present at a regular Lodge meeting, may elect a member in good standing to Life Membership upon the payment in advance of \$1,500.00.

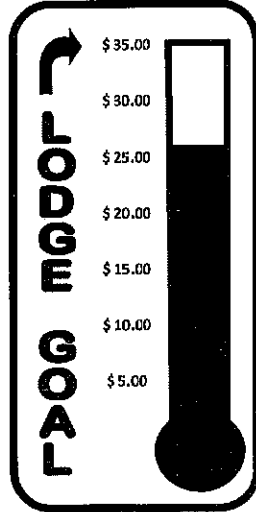
Happy New Year everyone! We hope everyone had a safe and joyous holiday season.

**WHAT IS "HOOP SHOOT" ?**



One of the Order's most impressive youth programs is the Elks "Hoop Shoot" National Free Throw Contest. With more than 3 million annual participants between the ages of 8 and 13, the odds of making it to the championship round of the Elks "Hoop Shoot" are less than 40,000 to 1. The odds of capturing one of the six national titles that are up for grabs each year are less than 500,000 to one! At an Elks "Hoop Shoot" Free Throw Contest, boys and girls in one of three age groups, 8 & 9, 10 & 11, 12 & 13, attempt to sink 25 free throws, 10 in the first round, and 15 in the second, with ties being resolved by 5 - shot shoot offs. The competition is fierce but fun, and that's one reason the Elks "Hoop Shoot" has grown, since 1946, from a local youth activity at the Corvallis, Oregon, Elks Lodge to one of the largest coeducational sports program for 8 to 13 year age groups in the country.

Our Lodge annually holds our Lodge sponsored "Hoop Shoot Contest" in January. All of our winners go on to the Elks Southeastern District "Shoot" and if they continue to win move on to state and national competition.

We need volunteers to score, referee, register shooters and help with the paper work. If you are not a volunteers still come out to watch the kids. You will be glad you did!

**NASCAR Club End of Season Party**

We would to thank every one worked in preparing for this event and especially to all who attended. It was a big success and we raised over \$1,100.00 for "Special Olympics". 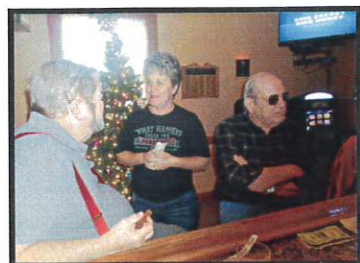
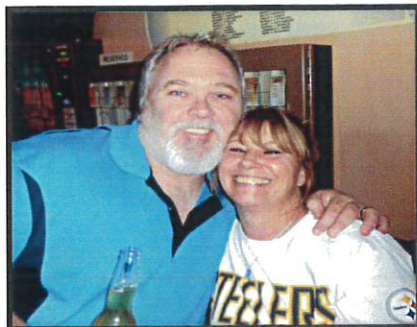

### RECIPE of the MONTH

#### Curried Shrimp with Peanuts

- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 tablespoon all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons curry powder
- 3/4 cup milk
- 3/4 cup chicken broth
- 1/3 cup ketchup
- 1 tablespoon grated fresh ginger
- 1/2 jalapeño pepper, seeded and chopped
- 1/4 teaspoon dried crushed red pepper (optional)
- 2 1/2 pounds peeled large, raw shrimp, deveined
- 2 teaspoons fresh lime juice
- 1/4 teaspoon kosher salt



Melt butter in a heavy saucepan over low heat; whisk in flour and curry powder until smooth. Cook, whisking constantly, 1 minute. Gradually whisk in milk, next 4 ingredients, and, if desired, dried crushed red pepper. Increase heat to medium, and cook, whisking constantly, 5 to 6 minutes or until mixture is thickened and bubbly. Stir in shrimp, lime juice, and salt. Reduce heat to medium-low, and cook, stirring often, 5 minutes or just until shrimp turn pink. Serve with desired toppings.

**Toppings:** salted cocktail peanuts, bean sprouts, toasted unsweetened flaked coconut, cilantro
