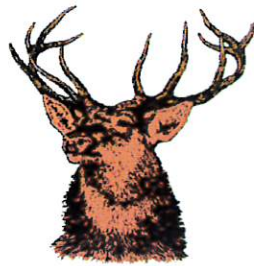

The Exalted Ruler may appoint additional committees as required. These committees are what makes the Lodge function in the Fraternal, Charity and Social commitments of our Order. The Bylaws also require a minimum of three members on each committee. Members may generally serve on more than one committee and all chairmen and members of committees serve at the pleasure of the Exalted Ruler. Volunteering to be a part of committees is a way a Member can help to make a difference! Next Month I will publish a list Committees and those that I know who want to serve next year. I would hope Members who are physically able and reside locally will join a committee. Being active on a committee only takes a few hours a month and the rewards are great, both for you and the Lodge. The Home Club House Committee is appointed by order of the Exalted Ruler consisting of seven Members and operates under the House Rules of the Lodge Bylaws (Article IX).

At the Regular Lodge Meeting on January 7th a motion was approved to change the Lodge Bylaws to lower the Regular dues from \$78.00 to \$60.00 per year and the Life Member advance purchase price from \$1,950.00 to 1,500.00. Please be aware that in addition to Regular Lodge dues all Members must also pay the Grand Lodge per capita fee and insurance assessment and the State Association dues (currently they total \$19.00 per year but may change slightly from year to year). Both Regular Lodge dues and the other fees are billed together and must be paid by March 31st to remain in good standing. The Bylaw changes reducing dues must be approved by the Grand Lodge Committee on Judiciary before they can be implemented. I have asked the Lodge Secretary to follow up on this so the new dues rate will be in effect when dues bills for Lodge Year 2015-2016 are mailed in early March 2015.

MEMBERSHIP: Well, this Lodge Year is almost up and it is obvious that the goal of 30 new members I set at the beginning will not be met. We Initiated 12 (40%) of the goal. There is still time to propose a candidate and have them initiated before the end of the Lodge Year. By now, even new Members, should know the process of gaining a new Member. I or any Lodge Officer will gladly help you in recruiting and remember there is a brochure with information about the Lodge and "ELKDOM" located by the front door that can help you. Why can't we get five applications in February? Answer, we can, if you and I will work at it! I will....Will YOU!

**Volunteers, ENF grants help
'Elevate America'**

Now is the time to finalize your plans for obtaining Elks National Foundation grants for your Lodge. Most Lodges have now achieved my \$4.60 per-capita goal for giving to ENF and have thus qualified for a Gratitude Grant. If your Lodge has not yet achieved the goal for the 2014-2015 Lodge year there is still time to make it so get busy. March 31 is the cut-off date to donate to the ENF. The Gratitude Grant of up to \$2,000 can be used for a variety of charitable community needs. Gratitude Grant applications are due no later than May 31, 2015.

Next consider and plan for a \$2,000 Promise Grant. A Promise Grant project must serve youth in need and events are required to be alcohol- and drug-free. This year's projects must be completed by July 31, 2015. Promise Grants are limited to the first 500 qualifying applications and new applications will be available July 1 for next year.

Beacon Grants are designed for ongoing, Elks-led, charitable community activities and the grants are available for up to \$2,000. These grants require bona fide "Elk involvement". Simply handing a check to a charity does not achieve our goal of elevating the status of the Lodge in the community through active Elk participation of worthy community projects. Any Lodge may apply and projects must be completed by July 31.

Freedom Grants, managed by the Veterans Service Commission, are oriented to projects that serve veterans or active duty military personnel and/or their families. They are competitive, limited in number, and the application period is August 1 through August 31. Active Elk involvement is also required.

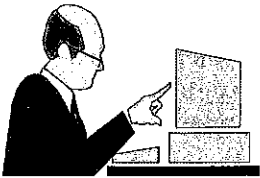
If you have a major community project in mind, an Impact Grant from ENF may be just the ticket. These grants are available for large scale, Elk-run service projects of up to \$10,000. The grants are competitive and require significant Elk involvement and community presence.

This summary will serve as your reminder of the various grants funded by Elks National Foundation "The Great Heart of Elkdom". Do not miss the opportunity to Elevate America and your community by taking advantage of the ENF grant program. Your community and your Lodge will be the beneficiaries!

RECIPE of the MONTH

Lasagna Rolls

Lasagna:

- 1 (15-ounce) container whole milk ricotta cheese
- 1 (10-ounce) package frozen chopped spinach, thawed, squeezed dry
- 1 cup plus 2 tablespoons grated Parmesan
- 3 ounces thinly sliced prosciutto, chopped
- 1 large egg, beaten to blend
- 3/4 teaspoon salt, plus more for salting water
- 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1 to 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 12 uncooked lasagna noodles
- 2 cups marinara sauce
- 1 cup shredded mozzarella (about 4 ounces)

Sauce:

- 2 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 4 teaspoons all-purpose flour
- 1 1/4 cups whole milk
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon ground black pepper & a Pinch ground nutmeg



To make the sauce: Melt the butter in a heavy medium saucepan over medium-low heat. Add the flour and whisk for 3 minutes. Whisk in the milk. Increase the heat to medium-high. Whisk the sauce until it comes to a simmer and is thick and smooth, about 3 minutes. Whisk the salt, pepper, and nutmeg into the sauce.

Preheat the oven to 450 °. Whisk the ricotta, spinach, 1 cup Parmesan, prosciutto, egg, salt, and pepper in a medium bowl to blend. Add a tablespoon or 2 of oil to a large pot of boiling salted water. Boil the noodles until just tender but still firm to bite. Drain. Arrange the noodles in a single layer on a baking sheet to prevent them from sticking. Butter a 13 x 9 x 2-inch glass baking dish. Pour the sauce over the bottom of the prepared dish. Lay out 4 lasagna noodles on a work surface, then spread a large spoonful (about 3 tablespoons worth) of ricotta mixture evenly over each noodle. Starting at 1 end, roll each noodle like a jelly roll. Lay the lasagna rolls seam side down, without touching, top with the sauce in the dish. Repeat with the remaining noodles and ricotta mixture. Spoon 1 cup of marinara sauce over the lasagna rolls. Sprinkle the mozzarella and remaining 2 tablespoons of Parmesan over the lasagna rolls. Cover tightly with foil. Bake until heated through and the sauce bubbles, about 20 minutes. Uncover and bake until the cheese on top becomes golden, about 15 minutes longer. Let stand for 10 minutes. Meanwhile, heat the remaining marinara sauce in a small saucepan over medium heat until hot, and serve alongside.

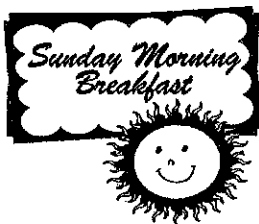

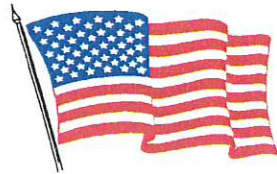
