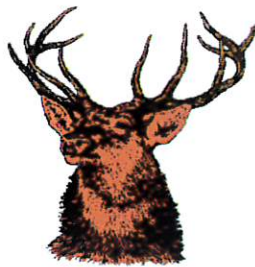

To do all of those things required a great effort from a lot of Members. **"THANK YOU ALL"**.

As we start the new Lodge Year, I would like to thank our Members who had the faith to elect me to my third consecutive term as the Exalted Ruler of our Lodge. *Thank You*. We have a lot of new Members in Lodge Officer Positions this year and Committee Chairman, too. My feeling is that we have a great team in place to move forward and have the best year this Lodge has ever had. I believe in the **TEAM**; from Lodge Officers, Committee Chairpersons and Members of Committees, and the Membership in general that we will make good things happen and be proud of our accomplishments this year. The faces in our Lodge Membership has changed in the past few years. It is a somewhat younger population and that is good, because they will be the future of our Lodge and Order. I encourage them to step up and be active in our Mission and I hope that the "over something" group (*drawing Social Security*) will help and encourage them to be and remain active in our Order.

If you have read my articles in this Newsletter during the past two years or talked to me in the Lodge or at Meetings you would understand that my **highest priority** has been a gain in **MEMBERSHIP**. At the beginning of the last Lodge Year I set a goal of thirty new Members for 2014-2015. **WE** did not make the goal! We initiated fifteen new members for only 50% of the goal! With five deceased, one transfer & five dropped for nonpayment of dues we will end the year with only a miserable net gain of plus three in overall Membership. That is unacceptable! I intend to appoint a Membership Committee who's mission will be to use all resources available from the Grand Lodge and other resources and be pro-active in recruiting candidates for Lodge Membership. The Committee also will investigate and verify candidates eligibility for Membership. That Committee will only be effective if all Lodge Members support the idea that Membership is the **"lifeblood of our Lodge"** and will work to recruit candidates for Membership.

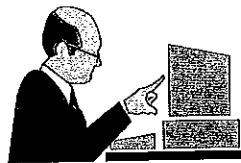

SECRETARYS NOTES



I Would like to start off by saying how much I appreciate the trust that the Membership displayed by electing me to be the Lodge Secretary for this 2015-2016 Lodge Year. I am replacing Mike Korb

who was Secretary of our Lodge for nineteen continuous Lodge Years and that is a hard pair of shoes to fill. I would to thank Mike for spending the time to help me learn the procedures and actions that the Lodge Secretary must know to be successful. Mike will close out all of the many end of year reports that must be submitted to the Grand Lodge by March 31, 2015, then I will officially start my duties as Secretary on April 1st.

Just to refresh Members memory, the Lodge Secretary is the Administrative Functionary for all Lodge endeavors under the direction of the Exalted Ruler. Duties in general include (but are not limited to) the following: maintaining records of the Lodge; receiving all funds generated by any Lodge activity and dispersing them appropriately; preparing Minutes of Lodge Meetings and maintaining Minutes of Lodge Committees; making all reports required by the Grand Lodge and the Virginia Elks Association; monitoring and insuring that all taxes are properly prepared, submitted and paid; maintaining Membership rolls; collecting dues and issuing Membership Cards; processing applications for Membership; monitoring or preparing all official Lodge correspondence; advising the Lodge Board of Trustees of issues requiring their action; assisting Members, Lodge Committees and the Exalted Ruler as required.

The Exalted Ruler has asked me to continue as the "ELK'S HORN" (our Lodge Newsletter) Editor and Publisher and I have agreed to do so. Collecting information, editing, designing, formatting, and printing is a 12 to 18 hour job each month. I would appreciate a volunteer(s) to help in folding, applying mailing seals, address labels, stamps and delivering them to the postal service, this normally takes 2 to 3 hours one day a month normally 4 to 5 days before the end of the month. Call Me!

In the past years I have helped committees and Members planning events and activities with flyers and advertising and I will continue to do so on a "time available basis" but please submit your requirements to me as far in advance as possible. Although, I am retired from any formal employment, I still have a family and they will always come first! Within the Lodge: my first priority will be the duties as Lodge Secretary, secondly as Newsletter Editor and then to help in all other Lodge activities. I will to be part of making our Lodge the best in all of "ELKDOM" in the new Lodge Year.

FROM the BOARD of TRUSTEES



The Board of Trustees held it's last Meeting for Lodge Year 2014-2015 on March 3, 2015. Edward (Sarge) McCurdy tendered his resignation as a Trustee to the Lodge Secretary for health reasons and Zalph Andrews also resigned in order to assume duties as Lodge Secretary for the next Lodge Year and both were effective on March

3, 2015. Paul Ferreira was elected as the Five Year Trustee to fill the normal rotational vacancy during the Regular Scheduled Elections of Lodge Officers on February 4, 2015. Bill Howell and Michelle Waddell were elected as the First and Four Year Trustees at a special election held on March 18, 2015 to replace the Board Members who resigned. The complete list of Board Members for Lodge year 2015-2016 is as shown at the bottom of page one of this newsletter.

Also, at the Board Meeting on March 3, 2015 the Board approved \$400 for a new Treasurers Desk, \$200 for a new chair and \$200 for a security container for bartenders cash drawers These recommendations were approved by the Membership.

It is that time of the year for the Board to prepare the Lodge Budget for Lodge Year 2015-2016. The past year approved Budget is posted on the Lodge Bulletin Board. Members planning activities and Committees must review it, especially Section 388-00, lines 388-01 through 388-21. If your activities request will change you must update it. If you are planning a new activity or event (not in previous year budget) you must submit the details and justification. There is a form to use for your submission in the box above the sign-in station by the front door of the Lodge. All requests or updates **MUST** be received before the scheduled Board meeting on April 7, 2015. You may place your inputs in the Secretary's Box or leave them with the bartender; but, be sure they are marked "FOR the TRUSTEES". The due date is driven by the requirement for the Board to present the Budget to the Lodge for approval at the second Scheduled Lodge Meeting on April 15, 2015 (a Bylaw requirement). Once the Lodge Year Budget is approved changes can take up to six weeks to be approved and funds for changes cannot be dispersed prior to approval by the Board and the Membership.

The Board of Trustees (with three new Members) will have our first Meeting of the new Lodge Year on April 7, 2015, we will elect a Board Chairman, Secretary and an Accident Prevention Manager. The Board of Trustees play a very important role in the management of the Lodge as we are responsible for all Lodge assets. We look forward to the new Lodge Year. We believe it will be very successful and we as your Board of Trustees will step forward help make it the best year ever!

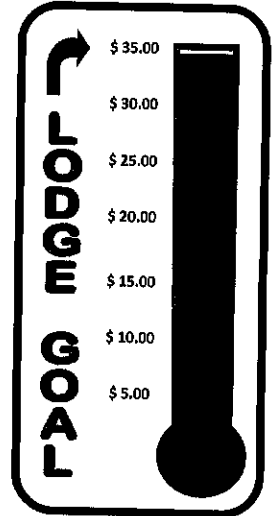

FROM the ELKS NATIONAL FOUNDATION COMMITTEE

The current ENF per capita report is \$34.78 and we remain in third place in the state. That still leaves twenty two cents yet to be raised by individual donations to meet the \$35.00 Lodge Exalted Ruler's Goal. The above amount is in an ENF report dated March 15th, and is not the final report for the 2014-15 Campaign Year. Another report is due around the 25th or 26th of March and the final report for Lodge Year 2014-2015 will be available in early in April. Also, at the Lodge Meeting on March 18, 2015 the Membership voted to make a Lodge Donation to the ENF of \$2,500 and this will add \$16.79 to our final total per capita amount for Lodge Year 2014-2015.



April starts the 2015-2016 ENF Campaign Year and the Exalted Rulers goal for our Lodge will remain the same at **\$35.00** per capita. For newer Members "per capita" is computed by the amount of donations in dollars divided by the total number of Members on the rolls at the beginning of the Lodge Year.

The ENF does so many good things, i.e. sponsors the Hoop Shoot, Most Valuable Student Scholarships, Community Investment and Drug Awareness programs just to name a few. All of this is made possible from your donations.

Please donate when you are able, and thanks to all who donated last year and help us have another successful **ENF CAMPAIGN THIS YEAR.**

Additionally, there some who have a misunderstanding of the check cashing policy. We for security and insurance reasons can not keep but so much cash on hand. Please work with us on this. There is an ATM in the Lodge.

The paragraphs below are quoted from the BY- LAWS & HOUSE RULES and Rules of the Order of Newport News Lodge # 315, BPOE of the USA.

Home Club Conduct

12. The conduct of Elks, their families and their guests within the Lodge and the Home Club shall be that expected of an Elk. Any act detrimental to good order will be cause for that person to be directed to leave the premises. This may be directed by a Lodge officer, House Committee member, the Club Manager, or the bartender on duty. Any violation of this rule will be followed by an investigation, possibly resulting in an official reprimand or the suspension of club privileges.
15. Criticizing and falsely maligning an officer of the Lodge with intent to harm Lodge Officers and cause dissention among members constitutes conduct unbecoming an Elk and is prohibited.
16. Vile, obscene and insulting language is an offense against the laws of the Order and is prohibited.

CHECK CASHING POLICY for BPOE LODGE # 315

1. Check cashing for Pull Tabs / VTabs shall not exceed \$100.00 per day. If a member wins more than their check amount then the Member will buy back their check.
2. When paying the bar or food tab the check amount shall not exceed more than \$20.00 above the cost of the tab.
3. Non Member checks are accepted only for bar or food and must be endorsed by the sponsoring Member.
4. Members cannot buy a check with a check of greater value. You can cash another check and buy back the first check with cash.
5. RETURNED CHECKS: \$ 25.00 fee applies. 1st offense will result in a warning letter. 2nd offence results in a 90 day suspension. 3rd offence results in loss of privileges for one year or more.
6. Please remember that we are NOT a bank. If you expect to spend a significant amount money in the Lodge on a given day (we hope you do), plan accordingly. There is an ATM available in the lodge.

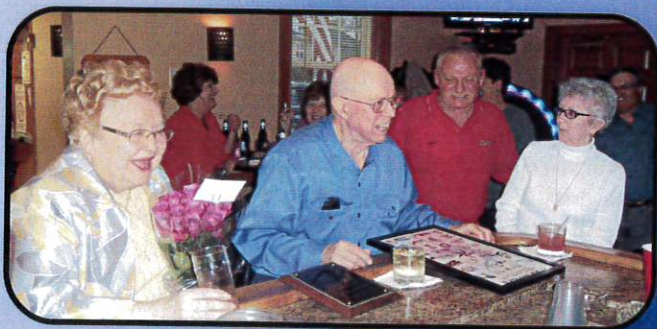

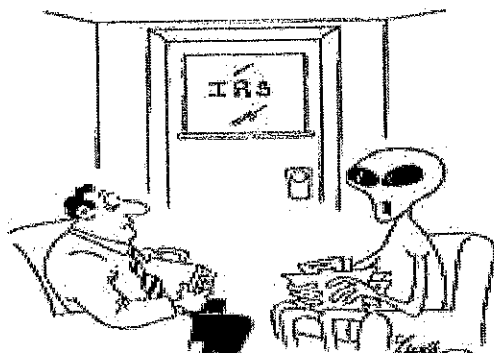
AN OLD PREACHER



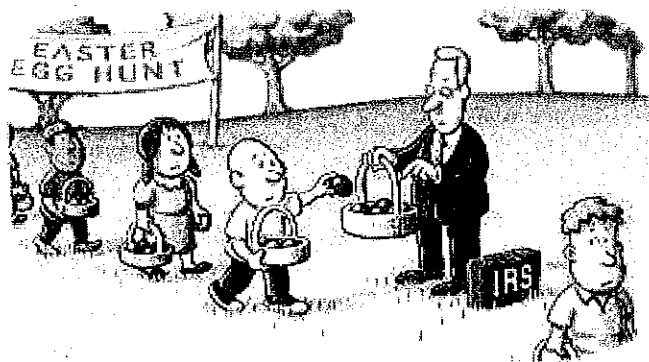

RECIPE of the MONTH

Shrimp-and-Black Bean Stir-Fry

1/2 medium-size red onion, sliced
 1 medium-size red bell pepper, sliced
 3 tablespoons olive oil, divided
 1 cup fresh corn kernels (about 2 ears)
 1 pound peeled and deveined large, raw shrimp
 3 garlic cloves, sliced
 1 cup chopped fresh mango or pineapple
 1 (15-oz.) can black beans, drained and rinsed
 1/2 cup teriyaki baste-and-glaze sauce
 1/4 cup pineapple juice
 Hot cooked rice
 Garnish: cilantro leaves

Stir-fry onion and bell pepper in 1 Tbsp. hot oil in a large cast-iron skillet over medium-high heat 2 to 3 minutes or until lightly browned. Remove from skillet. Add corn and 1 Tbsp. oil to skillet; stir-fry 2 to 3 minutes. Remove from skillet. Pat shrimp dry. Add shrimp, garlic, and remaining 1 Tbsp. oil to skillet; stir-fry 2 to 3 minutes or just until shrimp begin to turn pink. Add mango and black beans; stir-fry 2 to 3 minutes or until thoroughly heated. Add teriyaki sauce and pineapple juice, and cook 1 to 2 minutes or until mixture begins to bubble. Stir in corn-and-onion mixture. Serve over hot cooked rice.

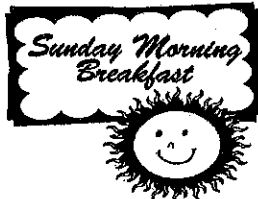
