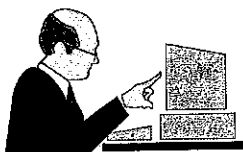

**SECRETARY NOTES**



First, I would hope all Members and their families are having a great summer season.

The Exalted Ruler is extremity concerned about the Membership status of our Lodge. His concerns are well founded as we are on track to have a net LOSS of total annual Membership for the first time in three years. As of the June 23, 2015 there are 15 delinquent Members. Last Month I published the names of 17 delinquents and two paid; however, the Exalted Ruler, Chairwoman of the Membership Committee and myself reviewed the list and are not optimistic that many of the 15 left will, for various reasons, pay their dues to remain in good standing. Also, we must remember that 12 Members are over 80 years of age (our oldest two Members are 92)! Therefore, the solution is to recruit, repeat, recruit **NEW MEMBERS!**

In the Exalted Rulers Article previous, he restated his goal or obtaining 40 new members this year. To date we have Initiated six and reinstated one and have one reinstatement pending a vote in July for 20% of his goal with 25% of the Lodge Year passed. Every Lodge Member residing locally should have a mission of recruiting a new member(s). We as a Lodge have a lot to offer. Bring a Candidate to the Lodge, tell them what we do, show them that we have a good time doing what we do. Also use the recruiting brochure available by the front door of the Lodge to help you answer their questions. Don't procrastinate find a new member today!

**FROM the GRAND EXALTED RULER**



What a journey this past year, and we are so elated at the progress you have made on our membership issues. It is the cherry on top of the cupcake. For the first time since the inception of CLMS reporting, our decline nationally was finally under 2 percent. This is encouraging news. In fact, we decreased our shrinkage from 2.8 percent at the end of the 2014 Lodge year to 1.6 percent at March 31, 2015. That is almost half! We need to keep membership concerns at the forefront because it is our Members who enable our community service, which elevates the human condition of our communities. Let's keep the "full court press" on again this year.

Concentrate on the three prongs of membership: (1) initiations; (2) delinquency reduction; and, (3) reinstatements. Last year we had some 51,000 initiations, but during our high point of membership in the late 1970s we were initiating 75,000 new Members per year. We need to close that gap.

As to delinquency, we must not drop from our rolls our delinquent Members until we have had a face-to-face conversation about their situation whenever possible. Lodge Secretaries, please do not drop delinquents before you have to. There may be "Sickness and Distress" involved in the delinquency that is worthy of consideration by the Lodge Standing Relief Committee.

As to reinstatements, those former Members joined us for a reason and they already know of our good works – use that to your advantage and be certain that your By-laws provide for a 60-day period when reinstatement fees are reduced to \$1. A Lodge that works hard during the year on all three phases will be sure to end in the PLUS column for the year.

Marcia and I are so honored to have served as Grand Exalted Ruler and First Lady. We have done our best to present you, the membership, with the high standards of leadership that you deserve. This year has been a most wonderful journey that we have thoroughly enjoyed. The gracious welcomes we have received from all quarters have been magnificent. Our thanks and gratitude do not seem to be enough. Our thoughts and good wishes will be with all of you, always.

return for Lodge Year 2014 - 2015 was received from the contracted Accountant, reviewed by the Lodge Audit and Accounting Committee and the Membership was notified at the June 17, 2015 Lodge Meeting. I forwarded the Report to the Grand Lodge on June 18, 2015.

**VOUCHERS:** Those who purchase goods or services for the Lodge must submit a voucher to the Secretary for payment of the expense. A receipt, if paid for by the member, or the bill, if not paid for by the member, must be attached to the back of the voucher. Attaching the receipt or bill to the back of the voucher allows those who must process it for payment to easily make the necessary entries on the face of the voucher. Also, remember that expenses, bills and costs not provided for in the Lodge Approved Budget must first be authorized by the Board of Trustees and approved by the Membership at a Lodge Meeting before Lodge funds can be dispersed.

Four Members have not payed their locker fee for this year. I sent you a letter in early May notifying you of this delinquency. Two of the four are also delinquent on Lodge dues. I will contact you one more time and if the fee is not payed by July 17, 2015 your locker will be emptied and made available for others to rent and you will have forfeited your right to a refund of your locker deposit.
