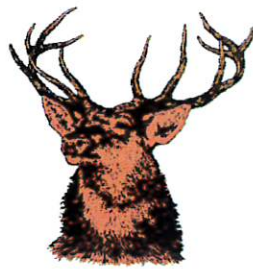

The next Lodge Year doesn't start for over seven months from now; so let's focus and keep moving ahead with our current Lodge Officers and Programs in the busy *fall* and *holiday* season coming!

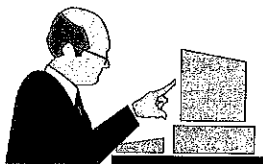

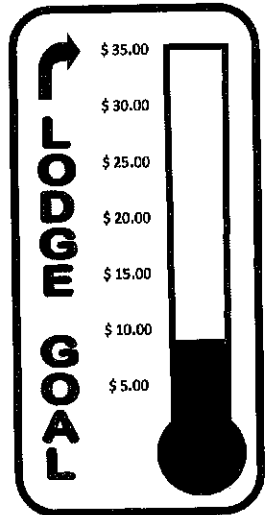

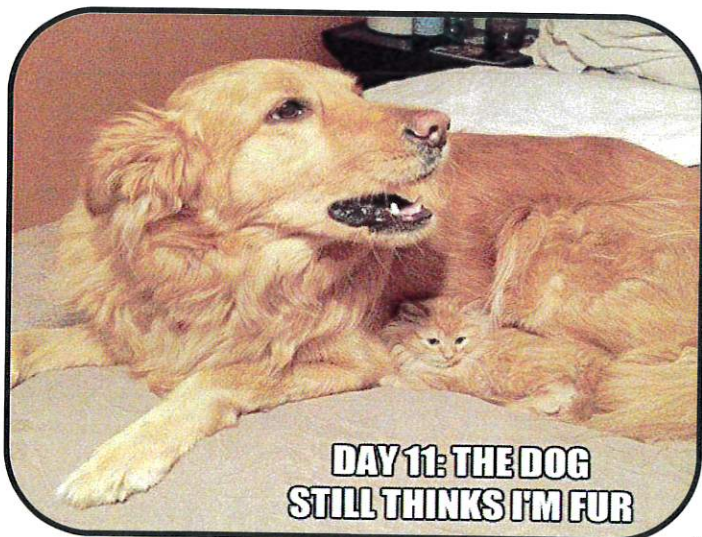
## Facebook in Real Life

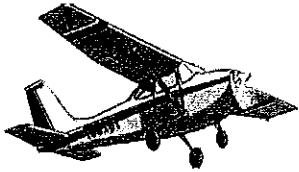

**RECIPE of the MONTH**

**Easy Chicken Cordon Bleu**

- 1 pkg. (6 oz.) *STOVE TOP* Stuffing Mix for Chicken
- 6 small boneless skinless chicken breasts (1½ lb.)
- 6 slices *OSCAR MAYER* Deli Fresh Smoked Ham
- 1 can (10¾ oz.) condensed cream of chicken soup
- 1 Tbsp. *GREY POUPON* Savory Honey Mustard
- 6 *KRAFT* Big Slice Swiss Cheese Slices

Heat oven to 400°F. Prepare stuffing mix as directed on package. Place chicken in 13x9-inch baking dish sprayed with cooking spray; cover with ham. Mix soup and mustard; spoon over chicken. Top with stuffing. Bake 25 min. or until chicken is done (165°F). Top with cheese; bake 5 min. or until cheese is melted.

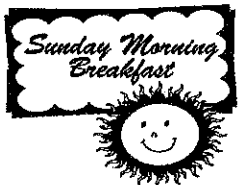

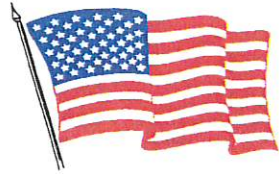
