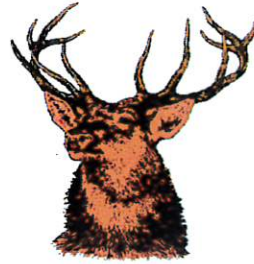

The answer to that question is: The ENF is an Endowment Fund that never uses the Fund's Principal to pay for the Charities, Scholarships, Drug Awareness, and Grants to Local Lodges to support their Community Activities, Veterans, Youth Programs and other chosen Lodge Programs. Also, note that the administrative overhead of the ENF is less than three percent. I am happy to report that as of the date of this Newsletter all Lodge Officers have made a donation this year. They set the example so all Members should follow. There is no template for a donation, anything from \$1.00 to *much more* is appreciated. You may fill out the donation envelope available by the front door and mail it or put in the Secretary Box and he will stamp and mail it for you. You may also place your donation (cash or check) in an envelope that the bartender has; but be sure to mark it for the ENF and put your name on it. The Secretary will submit it electorally and credit it to you. Please note donations to the ENF in most cases are tax deductible. **DONATE TODAY!**

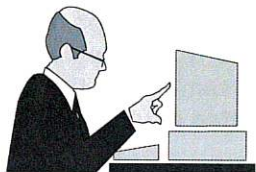

FROM the BOARD of TRUSTEES

The Board of Trustees held its Monthly Meeting on October 6, 2015. We discussed multiple Lodge issues.



Also at the Board Meeting, the Board approved to donate \$100 to ENF for the two members that passed away in the last few months. This recommendation was presented at the Lodge Meeting on October 21st and was approved by the

Membership. We also reviewed the previous month's payment vouchers and found no discrepancies.

We discussed on how to allocate the money (profit) from the Golf Tournament. It was decided up to allocate the funds to Lodge charities that we support. Chairmen of Committees should request funds from the Board.

It was brought up that the flags out front are deteriorated and falling apart. We agreed to request that the Lodge Secretary order new flags (three US and six each POW and ELK). Both the POW and the Elk flags out front were replaced with flags on hand.

As many local Members know the Lodge phone located at the bar has been unrealable. One day it will work fine and the next it won't take incoming calls. Trustee Bill Howell has been working with COX to fix the problem. It appears that COX Business will have to install new phone lines. The paperwork has been completed and we are waiting for Cox to install the new control boxes. Hopefully by the time you are reading this the new HD cable boxes will be in and hooked up.

So once again if anyone finds an issue or something that needs to be repaired, please let the bartender know and they will write it down. The book will be checked every day by one of the Trustees. The ENF per capita is \$17.51, and we remain first in the state. Total donation of donations to date is \$2,661.00.

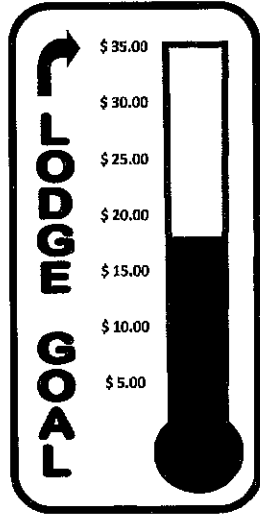
Time is going by quickly and we only have a few more months left to reach the thirty five dollar goal. That means we still need to keep on giving to insure we meet it.

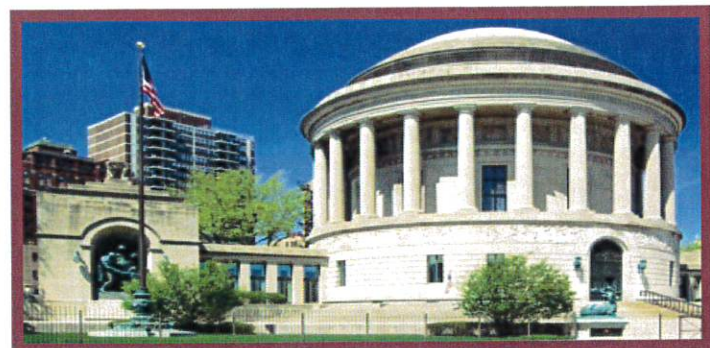

RECIPE of the MONTH

ITALIAN MEATLOAF

- 2 pounds ground beef
- 2 eggs
- ½ cup ketchup or tomato sauce
- 1 cup cracker crumbs
- 2 tablespoons parsley
- ½ teaspoon oregano
- ¼ teaspoon garlic salt
- ¼ teaspoon pepper
- 8 slices cooked ham
- 8 ounces pre-sliced mozzarella cheese
- Paprika

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Combine all ingredients except ham, cheese and paprika. Lay flat on wax paper. Place slices of ham (overlap) on meat loaf. Allow one inch on all sides. Put cheese on top of ham. Roll meat loaf and close seams. Place seam side down in baking pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 to 1¼ hours. Put 3 triangular cut slices of cheese on top of loaf, sprinkle with paprika and bake in oven for 5 more minutes or until cheese is melted. (Note: The ham may cause the hamburger to have a "pinkish" tint around the ham area this does not mean the meat loaf is undercooked). Enjoy!

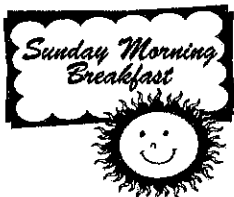

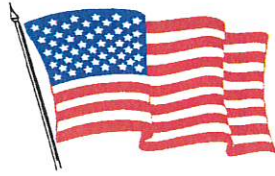
