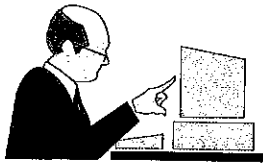

FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES



The Board of Trustees held its monthly meeting on December 8th, 2015. We discussed multiple Lodge issues.

We are still working on getting a new ice machine. We discussed getting more estimates. The one estimate we got was for almost \$6,700 and that is for a same size ice machine. The other estimate was for almost \$4,700 and that is for a smaller size ice machine.

We are also looking into leasing an ice machine. The good part is the company we lease it from would be responsible for the maintenance. The bad part that is over a period of many years we will end up paying more than the ice machine would originally cost. So we are working on it and as usual we are always open for suggestions. Come to the next Trustees Meeting or contact a Board Member and let us know if you have an idea on where to get an ice machine.

We have been discussing for the past couple months that the Elks Lodge needs to get a new accountant and bookkeeper. The one we currently have now is going to retire. We don't have much time, only a few months. So if anyone knows a good one please let us know.

We discussed replacing the fluorescent light fixtures in the dining room. I helped Tim Means the ER last summer take down the covers and wash them.

The fixtures are getting old and they are falling apart. This was previously voted on and approved over a year ago by the Membership. We will now proceed to replace them.

We also are getting ready to start working on the 2016-2017 budget. So if there is any committees that would like an increase in their budget, please come to a Trustees meeting with your proposal. There is a worksheet in the forms box by the front door that committees can use to make their submissions. And please don't wait too long because there is only a few months and only three more Trustees meetings before I have to present the budget to the ER and the Membership.

We also reviewed the previous month's vouchers for payment of Lodge Bills and found no discrepancies.

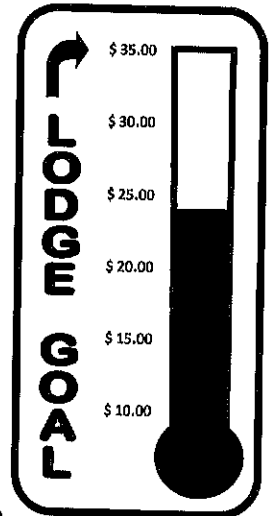
The Exalted Ruler attended our meeting and let us know that the pull tab machine is on order. Since our meeting the new pull tab machine has been installed and it looks great.

RECIPE of the MONTH

Salisbury Steak

Patties:

- 2 pounds lean ground beef
- 1 medium onion, finely minced
- ½ green bell pepper, finely minced
- 1 stalk celery, finely minced
- 2 tablespoons snipped parsley, minced
- 1 clove garlic, finely minced
- ½ teaspoon dry mustard
- ½ teaspoon dried marjoram, crushed
- ½ teaspoon dried thyme, crushed
- ½ teaspoon paprika
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon pepper



Sauce:

- 6 tablespoons butter
- 8 ounces sliced fresh mushrooms (about 2 cups)
- 2 teaspoons flour
- ¾ cup chili sauce (such as Heinz chili sauce)
- ½ cup beef broth
- 2 teaspoons lemon juice
- 2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce
- dash of bottled hot pepper sauce

To make the patties:

Preheat broiler. Place the beef in a large bowl. Add in the onion, bell pepper, celery, parsley, garlic, dry mustard, marjoram, thyme, paprika, salt and pepper. Lightly mix all of the ingredients together, being careful to not overwork the meat. Shape the mixture into 8 patties about ¾ inch thick. Place the patties under the broiler and cook for 12 to 14 minutes, or until done, turning halfway through.

To make the sauce:

While the steaks cook, make the sauce. In a large saucepan, melt the butter. Add the mushrooms. Cook for 4-5 minutes over medium-high heat until the mushrooms are tender. Sprinkle with the flour; stir. Add the chili sauce, beef broth, lemon juice, Worcestershire sauce and hot pepper sauce. Cook and stir until the mixture is bubbly. Cook for 1 minute more. Serve the sauce over the patties.

WHAT IS "HOOP SHOOT" ?



One of the Order's most impressive youth programs is the Elks "Hoop Shoot" National Free Throw Contest. With more than 3 million annual participants nation wide between the ages of 8 and 13. At an Elks "Hoop Shoot" Free Throw Contest, boys and girls in one of three age groups, 8 & 9, 10 & 11, 12 & 13, attempt to sink 25 free throws, 10 in the first round, and 15 in the second, with ties being resolved by 5 shot shoot offs. The competition is fierce but fun, and that's one reason the Elks "Hoop Shoot" has grown, since 1946, from a local youth activity at the Corvallis, Oregon, Elks Lodge to one of the largest coeducational sports program for 8 to 13 year age groups in the country.

Our Lodge annually holds our Lodge sponsored "Shoot" in January. All of our winners go on to the Elks Southeastern District "Shoot" and if they continue to win move on to state and national competition.

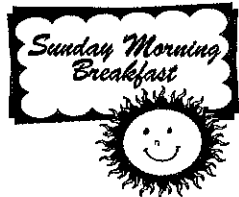

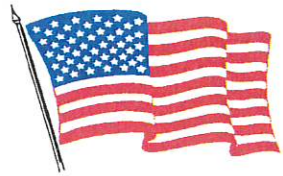
