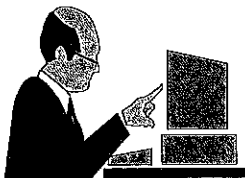

First off I would like to thank all my fellow Trustees for all their hard work cooking all 45 pork butts. And I would also like to thank all the others that

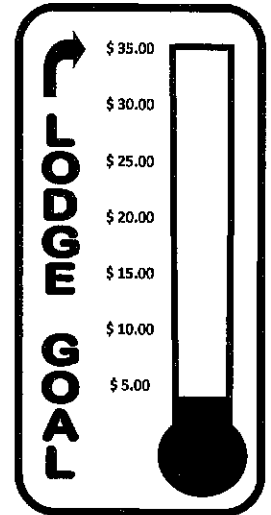

ELKS NATIONAL FOUNDATION (ENF) COMMITTEE REPORT

During the 2015-16 Lodge year, the Elks of Virginia donated \$86,851.74 to the Elks National Foundation. This year, the Foundation will give back the following: State Charities Grant: \$60,750.00 Special Projects Grant: \$49,550.00 Bonus Grant: \$13,100.00 These grants support the state's major charitable projects. Portions of these grants will also support the state's Drug Awareness Program, Hoop Shoot, Soccer Shoot and educational programs. Also, awarded was a total of 7 "Most Valuable Student" scholarships to high school seniors from Virginia. Lastly, the National Veterans Service Commission received \$7,920.00. These funds will help to provide aid and comfort to hospitalized veterans. That's a ratio of 2.019 for every dollar the Foundation received from Virginia.



When you give to the Elks National Foundation, you're doing more than funding the Foundation. So please help me with all members making a donation this year. So far we have started out \$3.43 per capita, Being 4th in state. Please continue donating. In closing, I would like to concur with the Exalted ruler in congratulating Karl Knobel on his Gold Pin, reaching \$20,000 in donations. Way to go Karl, thank you so much!

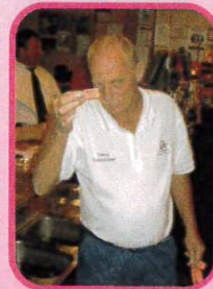

LOCKER - LOCK CHANGEOVER

Starting on June 1st we will be changing out the locks on Lockers. This is because the locks presently used are old and many are hard to use and there a no spares left for new rentals. Lockers containing alcoholic beverages are required to be locked. All locks are required to be master keyed (Virginia ABC regulations). During the exchange you will sign for the lock & keys you receive. Please read the contract you will be signing. The bartenders will have the new locks & keys. You may keep the old lock if you wish but it cannot be used on your locker or on anything in the Lodge. The three members who have not yet paid your locker fee will not get a new lock & key until the fee is paid and on June 15th the locker will be emptied and made available to another Member. **YOU SHALL NOT USE A PERSONAL LOCK ON A LOCKER IN THE LODGE.** On June 30th all old locks will be removed from the lockers. Also remember an alcoholic beverage stored in your locker must have your name on the bottle or container. If you share a locker only the Member who signs for the lock and key is responsible to the Lodge.

RECIPE of the MONTH

ENCRUSTED FLOUNDER

- 1 cup all purpose flour
- 2 pounds flounder fillets
- 2 large eggs
- ½ cup canola oil
- 3 cups crumbled potato chips

Place flour in a shallow container. Beat eggs and milk together in another shallow container. Place potato chips in a third shallow container. Dredge fillets in flour, then dip in egg mix-ture. Place fillets in potato chips and press into both sides. Place oil in a large sauté pan over medium heat. Add flounder and cook until golden brown on both sides. 
