Our Membership status are a lot better now than at this time last year. However, I am setting a goal of TWELVE (12) new Members during the last half of the Lodge Year, that equals two per month. In the *Secretary Notes* following he presents a lot of demographics about Lodge Membership. Noteworthy in his data is the fact that 37 Members are over the age of 70. I do not advocate recruiting young adults over any other age category; however, when you propose a new candidate the test in your mind should be; will they support and be active in our Lodge and the Order of Elks. That said, recruit a new Member TODAY!

Remember that starting in September we return to two meetings (1st & 3rd Wednesdays) a month for the rest of the Lodge Year.

This year we have already meet the Elks National Foundation Grand Exalted Ruler quota of \$4.65 per capita (we are at \$10.82). I know that we are asking Members to donate to a lot of functions this fall; but don't forget the ENF. I request that all Lodge Officers participate with a donation; however small. Last year five of our six Scholarship winners received \$9,000 in assistance (funding) from the ENF.

I again asked the Lodge Secretary to review the minutes to determine the average attendance at Lodge Meetings and I discovered that the number is 20.9 over the past six months that is 13% of Membership residing in the local area. There are 15 Lodge Officers who must attend (and most do), so that leaves five or six other Members attending. I will say to all Members who reside in the local area that Lodge business is conducted at Lodge Meetings. Be there or you LOOSE your right to complain about the business conducted!

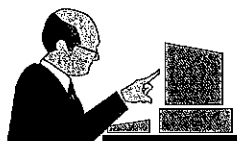

The Lock change out for Lockers is complete. There are some lockers available for Members. Contact me if you wish to rent a locker.

I was asked to provide the demographics of the Lodge Membership. The current Membership total is 160 + one pending Initiation. The average age is 59.8. The youngest Member is 22 years old and the oldest is 93. Four are under 30 years old (two of the them are delinquent in dues). Thirty three are over 70 years old, of those, 12 are over 80 and 2 are over 90. Veterans number 57 (36% of Membership). Past Exalted Rulers (PER) are 11 in number and three are Past District Deputy Grand Exalted Rulers (PDDGER). We have 13 Life Members. Thirty seven Members have been Elks for over 25 years and of those nine have 40 years and three have over 50 years. Twenty two Members are female. Members live in 13 different places. In Virginia, 126 reside in Newport News, eight in Yorktown, four in Williamsburg, four in York County, four in Gloucester, three in Hampton, two in Hayes & one in Bena. Out of state Members include three in North Carolina, two in Florida and one each in California, Oklahoma and Ohio.

I have discovered that some Members home addresses, phone numbers and email addresses have changed. If any of these have changed in the past two years please let me know. Submit changes to me using contact information in the last paragraph of these notes or leave in in the Secretary's Box by the front door at the Lodge.

Newsletters are distributed on a basis of one per household, whether you pick up at the Lodge or receive it in the mail. The exception is if an issue has an official announcement requiring all Members to be notified in writing (such as a proposed change in By-Laws) then each Member will receive a copy.

the systems were constantly running against each other. The lodge received an extremely high electric bill last month, almost \$1,000.00. I understand that it's been really hot out but that is a ridiculous amount for an electric bill. Only the bartenders and the Trustees are allowed to change the temperature settings on the thermostats. The other night I went to the lodge and a couple of people asked me why it was so hot inside the lodge. I checked the temperature and it was 78 degrees.

The thermostats we all set right. But for some reason the exhaust fan in the kitchen over the stove was left on. Don't know how long it was on for but as soon as I turned it off. The temperature started dropping. The exhaust fan should only be turned on while someone is cooking.

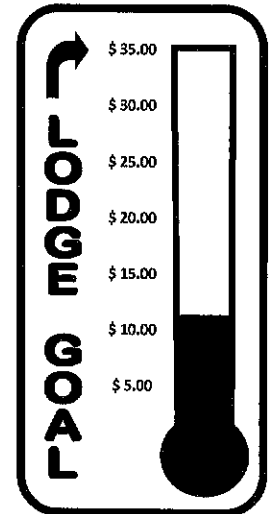
And I just want to let everyone know that the ice machine wasn't broken last week. The drain was clogged. And the only way to unclog the drain is taking all the ice out to get to the drain. I will be attending a House Committee meeting and see if we can come up with a cleaning/sanitizing schedule. It needs to be done at least twice a year if not three times a year.

We also reviewed the previous month's payment vouchers and found no discrepancies.

RECIPE of the MONTH

CHICKEN WITH SOUR CREAM GRAVY

- 4 to 6 chicken breasts
- ¼ cup butter or margarine
- 1 cup Sprite®
- ½ cup chopped celery
- 1 tablespoon dried onion flakes

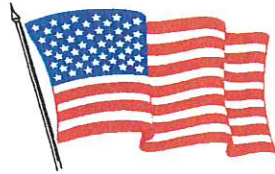
