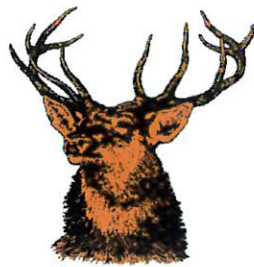

**FROM the BOARD of TRUSTEES**

At the first Regular Scheduled Lodge Meeting in February (February 4, 2017) nominations for elected Officer Positions can be made by any Member in good standing and present. Remember the PER slate is a recommendation only and those on that slate must be nominated by a Member. At the Meeting the Exalted Ruler will close nominations. At the second February Meeting (February 16, 2017) Elections will be held.



The Board of Trustees held its monthly meeting on December 6<sup>th</sup>, 2016. We discussed multiple lodge issues.

We also reviewed the previous month's payment vouchers and found no discrepancies.

Also at the Board Meeting, the Board approved to donate \$2500.00 to THRIVE.

We also discussed having a food drive for the THRIVE food pantry.

In the first week of March dues bills for the next Lodge Year will be mailed. Your total bill will be \$79.00 and is due by March 31, 2017. The Dues include \$60.00 Lodge # 315 dues + \$16.00 Grand Lodge Assessment + \$3.00 Virginia Elks Association Dues. You must pay the full \$79.00 to remain in good standing. Also if you have a locker the \$15.00 annual fee must be paid with your dues or your locker will be closed.

We just want to let everyone know that the flood lights on the exterior of our building and around the rest of the complex are the responsibility of the Condominium Association (Piccadilly Walk / Spanish Village) owned by Member Edward McCurdy, aka, "Sarge". It is his responsibility to repair or replace the lights when they burn out. The Lodge pays an annual fee to the Association (\$3,800.00) that includes that type of maintenance. I know it's a safety hazard at night but like just I said its "Sarge's" responsibility to fix them. Talk to Him!

At the Lodge Meeting on January 4, 2017 the Exalted Ruler will open the floor for nominations to fill the vacant position of Five Year Trustee. Remember that Trustees serve five year terms thus the elected replacement will finish this Lodge Year and serve four additional years this is because Trustees automatically move up one position each year.

If you attended the Lodge meeting on the 21<sup>st</sup> of December you would have heard Secretary read a letter from Bill Howell resigning as the Five Year Trustee because he is moving out of state. We am sorry to see him go but we totally understand his reasons. We hope someone will step forward to serve in this position. It will be a 4.25 year position. I know that being a Trustee is a demanding position, but I enjoy it, and I know that anyone else will also enjoy it. Nominations for the position will be at the January 4, 2017 Lodge Meeting and may be voted on.

**RECIPE of the MONTH**

**Texas Sheet Cake with Fudge Icing**

- 1½ cups spicy, fruity cola soft drink (such as Dr Pepper)
- 1 cup vegetable or canola oil
- ½ cup unsweetened cocoa
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 1 cup firmly packed light brown sugar
- 1½ teaspoons baking soda
- ½ teaspoon table salt
- ½ cup buttermilk
- 2 large eggs, lightly beaten
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- Vegetable cooking spray
- Fudge Icing
- 1¼ cups chopped toasted pecans



Preheat oven to 350°. Bring first 3 ingredients to a boil in a medium saucepan over medium-high heat, stirring often. Remove from heat. Whisk together flour and next 4 ingredients in a large bowl. Add soft drink mixture, and whisk until blended. Whisk in buttermilk, eggs, and vanilla. Pour batter into a lightly greased (with cooking spray) 17 1/2- x 12 1/2-inch sheet pan. Bake at 350° for 18 to 22 minutes or until a wooden pick inserted in center comes out clean. Prepare Fudge Icing, and pour over warm cake. Sprinkle with pecans. Cool completely

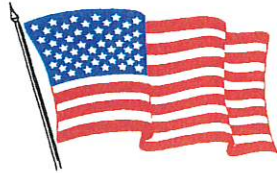
