I have a subject to discuss that some Members, and you will know who you are, need to be reminded of. Lodge Hours are set by the Home Club House Committee (Paragraph 4b. of the House Rules). In addition to published hours, I as the Exalted Ruler have the authority to close the Lodge under special circumstances! I do not use this authority without good reason and mostly when there is a **severe weather problem** or a **safety** issue (such as a gas leak). **WHEN** the LODGE is **CLOSED** — It is **CLOSED!** Officers and Members who have Lodge keys and security code access are **NOT** - to enter the Lodge when it is closed, except in an emergency that would require you as a specific officer to do so in the performance of your emergency Officer duties. Consuming alcoholic beverages in the Lodge when it is closed and no ABC designated manager is present and servng would be a violation of Virginia Law (ABC) and Members being present in the Lodge when closed could also have an adverse effect on our Insurance. Also, I have been made aware that some Members who are not specified Officers, Committee Chairman or Employees have Lodge keys both to the Main Doors and the Secretary, Treasurer & Exalted Ruler's Offices. I have directed that the Board of Trustees to review key control policy and retrieve keys from persons not authorized to have them. Also, I directed the Lodge Secretary to update the Key Control Log based on the Trustees key policy .

For over 20 years Freddie Roehr in addition to his other Lodge duties served as the Sickness and Distress Advocate for the Lodge. These duties included being the point of contact for providing information to the Lodge for Members ill or those that have passed, sending cards, ordering fruit baskets & flowers as appropriate and visiting sick Members as required. Member Raymond Fletcher (PER) has volunteered to perform these duties for the Lodge. His contact information is provided under the Sickness & Distress section following and is posted on the Lodge Bulletin Board.

I will say to all Members who reside in the local area that Lodge business is conducted at Lodge Meetings. Be there or you **LOOSE** your right to complain about the business conducted!

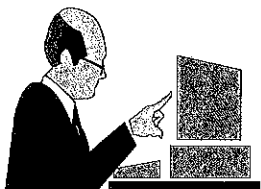

SECRETARY NOTES



We are winding down on Lodge Year 2016-2017 and during February Lodge Officers will be nominated and elected for the next Lodge Year 2017-2018. At the Regular Scheduled Lodge Meeting on February 1st the PER Association will present their

“recommended” slate and the floor will be opened for nominations. Nominations will be closed at the end of new business. At the second Meeting on February 15th elections will be held. Members must be present and in good standing to vote. The election will be by a secret written ballot. The positions to be elected include the Exalted Ruler, Esteemed Leading Knight, Esteemed Loyal Knight, Esteemed Lecturing Knight, Secretary, Treasurer & the Five Year Trustee. The other Trustees will move up one position and the other four Jeweled Officers will be appointed by the Exalted Ruler elect.

Notice: Dues statements will be mailed during the last week of February. Dues for Lodge Year 2017-2018 will be \$79.00. Your statement includes \$60.00 Newport News Lodge # 315 Dues + \$16.00 Grand Lodge Fees and Assessments + \$3.00 Virginia Elks Association Dues = \$79.00. To remain in good standing you must pay the total of \$79.00. If you have a Locker your Fee is \$15.00 and must be paid concurrent with your dues or your locker will be closed.

I would ask all members to respect the Lodge published hours of operation. You may not realize the problems that you can cause that would affect all Members if by your actions the Lodge is penalized for the actions of a few!

Recently several Members have contacted me asking why they were not receiving their Newsletters. The problem is that they have changed their addresses and not notified the Lodge of the change. If you move please let me know. Also, if more than one Member share the same address only one Newsletter is mailed to that address. The exception to this is if the Newsletter is used to notify Members of issues that the Statutes require notification to members be in writing such as a change of Bylaws then all members will receive a Newsletter.

There are five Bulletin Boards at various places in the Lodge. The one by the side door to the Lodge is the official place where required notices such as Balloting on Candidates are posted. It is labeled as the “Official Lodge Notice Board”. When in the Lodge please note the contents posted there.

We had a great New Year's Eve Party! Lots of Members and guests came out to ring the New Year in. In February we will hold a Super Bowl Party, Valentine's Day Dinner, and a Chili Cook Off

held by Art Roberson and Jennifer Curran as a fundraiser for "Free to Breathe".

We are still having a lot of problems with Members not understanding or not willing to abide by the check cashing rules, so please read the following carefully. The Lodge Check Cashing Policy is partially restated as follows: "*When paying a bar tab or cost of a meal or other Lodge sponsored activity the total check amount shall not exceed the amount due plus \$20.00. The \$20.00 cash overage is a once a day option. Additionally, a \$100.00 maximum check may be cashed for purpose of playing a gaming machine; however, if on any one transaction you cash a check and play a gaming machine and win more than the amount of the check you wrote then the face value of your check will be deducted from your payout and your check will be returned to you. Each subsequent transaction in any one day will be treated in the same manor. There are no exceptions to this policy.*" If you do not wish to follow these procedures then the your option is to use the ATM machine or bring cash for funds to play on gaming machines".

The Lodge is not a Bank! We cannot maintain but a certain amount of cash on hand in the Lodge and be properly insured.

RETURNED CHECK POLICY IS AS FOLLOWS: A returned check will result in a fee assed of \$25.00 + associated bank charges + the face value of the check. A first offense will result in a warning. A second offense results in a 90 day suspension. A third offense results in one year suspension. Any returned checks not redeemed within 10 business days of notification will result in an indefinite suspension of privileges. If check is returned at no fault of the Member then the House Committee may waive the Lodge fee and suspensions; however the Member is responsible to notify and provide information of the circumstances involved.

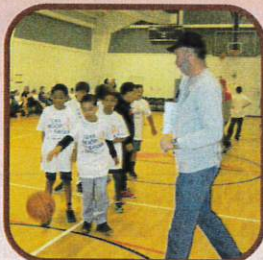
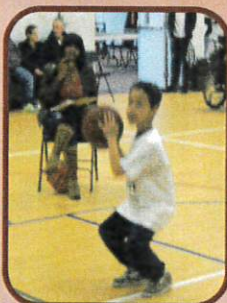

RECIPE of the MONTH

Seared Salmon with Potatoes, Cabbage and Horseradish Vinaigrette

- 1 lb. new red potatoes
- Kosher salt and pepper
- ½ small head savoy cabbage
- 4 scallions
- 1 tbsp. prepared horseradish
- 1 tbsp. white wine vinegar
- 2 tbsp. olive oil
- 1 skinless salmon fillet



Place the potatoes in a medium saucepan. Add enough cold water to cover and bring to a boil. Add 1 tsp salt, reduce heat and simmer for 10 minutes. Add the cabbage and simmer until the potatoes and cabbage are just tender, 5 to 8 minutes more. Drain and run under cold water to cool slightly. Cut the potatoes in half. Transfer the cabbage and potatoes to plates. Meanwhile, in a small bowl, combine the scallions, horseradish, vinegar, 2 Tbsp oil, ¼ tsp salt and ¼ tsp pepper. Heat the remaining tsp oil in a large nonstick skillet over medium-high heat. Season the salmon with ½ tsp salt and ¼ pepper, and cook until opaque throughout, 3 to 4 minutes per side. Serve the salmon with the potatoes and cabbage, and drizzle with the vinaigrette.

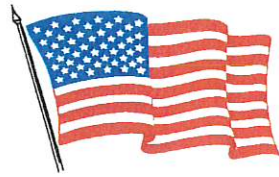
