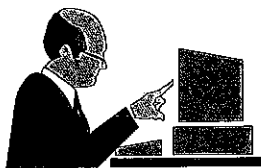

SECRETARY NOTES

As we are starting the second month of the Lodge new year I will say that all reports required of the Grand Lodge have been submitted and our per capita fees paid.

Membership dues are another matter! We have a substantial number of Members with more than one year of Membership who are delinquent in dues payment. Remember the only way you can enter the Lodge is with your payment in hand. Next Month I will publish a list of delinquent Members, If you don't want to see your name there, then send you dues soon.

I will remind all Committee Chairman and Lodge Members that all correspondence whether on Lodge Letter Head or not involving the Lodge in any way is considered official correspondence of the Lodge and a copy shall be provided to the Secretary for proper filing. Also, any correspondence committing Lodge funds to an external entity even when approved at a Lodge Meeting **SHALL** be signed by the Exalted Ruler.

I will remind Members that the Order of Business at a Lodge Meeting is set by the Statutes of the Order and our By Laws. Generally any Motion for the expenditure of Lodge funds is properly presented under New Business. If you have any questions please talk to the Exalted Ruler or the Secretary before the Meeting starts.

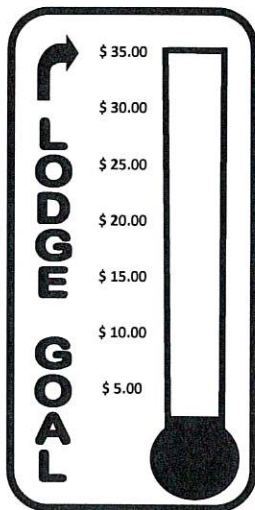

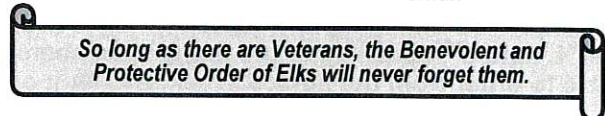

FROM the HOME CLUB HOUSE COMMITTEE



The Lodge Home Club House Committee has conducted a extensive review of the costs associated with the services we provide. We concluded that prices must be increased in some areas. Please note beer prices have not been raised in the Lodge in four years. During that period the wholesale cost of beer has increased 21%. Also the cost of food has risen significantly over the past few years. If you do not believe this check out what hamburger costs at "Food Lion" now compared to three years ago! We have tried to minimize price increases; however, increases are required in order to continue to provide the services you expect. Below is a synopsis of Increases in price and menu changes. These changes will be effective on May 1, 2017.

- Beer will be raised \$.20 per can or bottle. Draft beer will not change. The charge for a setup from a Member Bottle will not change.
- From the Snack Menu, the Jalapeno Poppers, Fried Shrimp, Steamed Shrimp and Fire Basket will be removed. In their place we will be adding Taquitos, Loaded Potato Skins and Loaded Fries. The Combo will be modified to replace the Poppers with the potato Skins. Loaded Fries and Loaded Nachos will cost \$7.95. The Burger and Fries Basket will increase to \$7.00. All other items on the Snack Menu will increase by \$1.00.
- All items on the Weekday Menu (flip side of Snack Menu) will increase by \$.25 cents, adding Fries will remain \$1.00.
- The Breakfast Menu full meal items, such as the "Bull Elk" and the "Stampede" will increase by \$1.00. Some al-a-cart items will also increase. Bacon will be \$1.50 for two slices, Sausage \$1.00 per Pattie, Link Sausage \$2.00, Sausage gravy and biscuit \$1.50 plus an egg \$2.50, 1 pancake \$1.50 / 3 for \$3.50 and 4 slices of tomato \$1.00. All other al-a-cart items will remain the same.

We will also be changing the Saturday Night Dinners to the 1st and 3rd Saturday of the month. Members will be able to order from the normal Weekday Menu or

Snack Menu when no dinner is scheduled. If you would like to volunteer to cook on an off night please let us know and a sign up sheet and flyer will be posted.

RECIPE of the MONTH

DEVILED EGGS

Deviled eggs are a staple at any setting requiring Hors d'oeuvres. The Recipe below is based on 1 dozen eggs (24 servings)

Basic Mixture

- ½ cup mayonnaise
- ¼ teaspoon course black pepper
- ¼ teaspoon (garlic powder, optional)
- 1 teaspoon yellow mustard
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- dash Worcestershire sauce



Boil eggs until hard. Split eggs long ways and remove yolks. Combine yolks with mixture from above and add fillings of choice. Fill egg halves with choice of fillings from below and garnish.

Deviled Egg Fillings

Classic: Basic mixture plus sweet pickle relish. Garnish with paprika.

Olive & Pimento: Basic mixture plus finely diced stuffed green olives. Garnish with thin slices of stuffed olive.

Black Olive: Basic mixture plus finely chopped ripe olives and minced onion, Garnish with thin slices of ripe olive.

Bacon & Spice: Basic mixture plus bacon bits and Cayenne pepper. Garnished with diced Pimiento.

Ham & Cheese: Basic mixture plus finely diced ham and finely grated cheddar cheese. Garnished with a spot of cheese.

South of the Border: Basic mixture plus finely chopped Jalapeño pepper and grated Jack cheese. Garnished with a thin slice of Jalapeño pepper.

Boiling Eggs: Place eggs in a pan single layer only and cover with ½ inch of water. Place on stove burner and turn heat on high until water comes to a hard boil. As soon as the water boils turn the heat off, place a lid on the pan and let the eggs sit on the burner for 20 to 30 minutes.
Peel eggs while still warm.

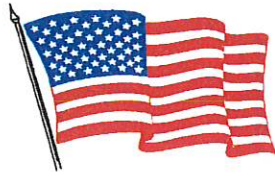
