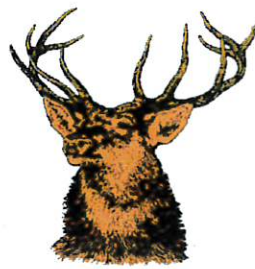

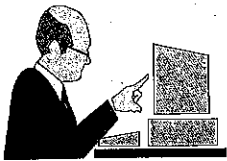

This past year Donna and I have had the unique opportunity to travel from coast to coast and witness the noble work to which our Order is dedicated. Our Lodges and State Associations are a credit to our Order, communities and nation. As we traveled from state to state we were very impressed with the services the State Major Projects provide to our youth, veterans and communities.

While there are many great fraternal and charitable organizations nationwide, none can compare with the range of programs and services we offer to our communities and to those less fortunate or in need.

Our reach as Elks, and range of services and programs, is incredible. Those services include youth summer camps; medical facilities for children with cancer or cerebral palsy; and clinics and institutes for children with sight or speech issues; and many other physical and mental disorders. Elks also sponsor alternative schools; provide emergency shelters for abused and neglected children; provide mobile dental care; award scholarships; and provide career training for adults with developmental disabilities. We also award financial aid to community hospitals, Special Olympics, as well as Alzheimer's programs and services.

I had the opportunity to meet with military leaders and Veterans Administration officials during my visit to Washington DC, where I received resounding gratitude and admiration for the Elks' service to the military and for our veterans. I also visited numerous veterans homes nationwide, where the local administrators had nothing but praise for our volunteer VAVS representatives who visit and provide comfort, support and aid to those confined in veterans homes, hospitals and other facilities.

I also would like to share with you some encouraging news regarding membership. Over the past three years we have decreased our losses from 1.6 percent at the end of the 2015 Lodge year, to 1.1 percent at the end of the 2016 Lodge year, and to a projected 0.6 percent on March 31, 2017. We need to continue to work diligently on initiating new Members and decreasing lapsation in the coming year to finally turn that corner and experience our first gain since 1980.

Donna and I are honored to have served as your Grand Exalted Ruler and First Lady. We have had the pleasure of meeting many new friends, and enjoyed the gracious hospitality of all the membership during our visits. Thank you for *Caring and Sharing*, and for continuing to demonstrate that "Elks are Leading the Way."

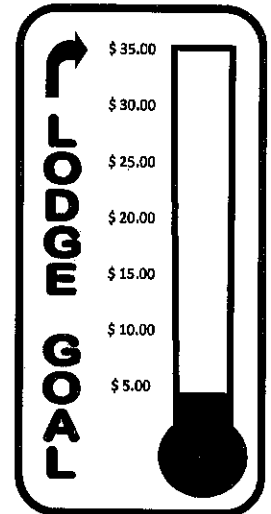
FROM the ELKS NATIONAL FOUNDATION COMMITTEE

Currently our Lodge is at \$4.75 per capita. We have reached the Grand Exalted Rulers Goal! Thank you to all that have donated! Following are examples of how annually ENF monies collected help Elks and their families in Virginia. Please continue to help ENF with your donations & be on the lookout for our first ENF fund raising dinner.

During the 2016-2017 Lodge year, the Elks of Virginia donated \$93,844.96 to the Elks National Foundation. This year, the Foundation will give back the following: State Charities Grant: \$66,190.00, Special Projects Grant: \$50,670.00 & Bonus Grant: \$13,860.00. These grants support Virginia State's major charitable projects, as well as other philanthropic projects. Portions of these grants will also support Virginia's Drug Awareness Program, Hoop Shoot, Soccer Shoot and Educational Programs. The ENF will award a total of 7 "Most Valuable Student" scholarships to high school seniors from Virginia valued at \$28,000.00. In addition, they will award up to 4 Legacy scholarships to children, grandchildren and stepchildren of Elks valued at \$16,000.00. Also the Elks National Veterans Service Commission will offer \$7,920.00 that will help provide aid and comfort to hospitalized veterans. The Grand Total for Virginia will be \$182,640.00. That's a ratio of 1.946 for every dollar the Foundation received from Virginia last year.

A LITTLE TIDBIT OF TRIVIA

ON JULY 20, 1969, AS COMMANDER OF THE APOLLO 11 LUNAR MODULE, NEIL ARMSTRONG WAS THE FIRST PERSON TO SET FOOT ON THE MOON. HIS FIRST WORDS AFTER STEPPING ON THE MOON, "THAT'S ONE SMALL STEP FOR MAN, ONE GIANT LEAP FOR MANKIND," WERE TELEVISED TO EARTH AND HEARD BY MILLIONS.

BUT, JUST BEFORE HE RE-ENTERED THE LANDER, HE MADE THE ENIGMATIC REMARK "GOOD LUCK, MR. GORSKY." MANY PEOPLE AT NASA THOUGHT IT WAS A CASUAL REMARK CONCERNING SOME RIVAL SOVIET COSMONAUT. HOWEVER, UPON CHECKING, THERE WAS NO GORSKY IN EITHER THE RUSSIAN OR AMERICAN SPACE PROGRAMS.

THIS TIME HE FINALLY RESPONDED BECAUSE HIS MR. GORSKY HAD JUST DIED, SO NEIL ARMSTRONG FELT HE COULD NOW ANSWER THE QUESTION.

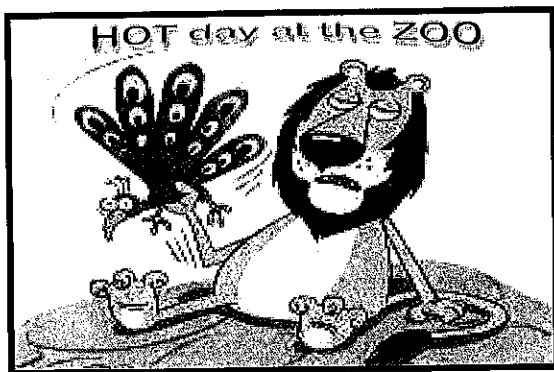
HERE IS THE ANSWER TO "WHO WAS MR. GORSKY"

RECIPE of the MONTH
Fiesta Chicken and Rice Burritos

- 3 cups rotisserie chicken shredded
- 2 cups fully cooked white or Mexican rice
- 1 (15 oz) can black or pinto beans
- 1 (15 oz) container fresh salsa
- 1 (8 oz) pkg shredded cheese
- 6 soft burrito tortillas

Preheat oven to 325°F. Combine shredded chicken, rice, beans, and salsa in a bowl. Place portion of mixture in each tortilla, top with cheese, and roll up burrito. Wrap each burrito in foil and heat in oven until warm, about 15 minutes.

Tips

1. Customize with a variety of beans: black, garbanzo, kidney, navy or lentils.
2. Swap out chicken with shredded pork.
3. Serve with a side of sour cream or guacamole.
4. Add chopped cilantro and onion for more flavor.

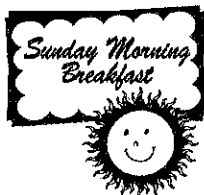

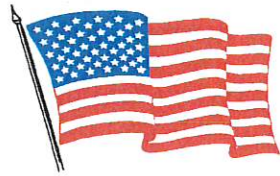
