During our Regular Scheduled Lodge meeting on June 21st the Secretary read two proposals to change the Statutes of the Order. The first was to delete the short version of the Membership Initiation Ritual which we use (the long version takes approximately 45 minutes to perform) and the second was to require a lodge to perform an initiation ritual during a DDGER visit whether the lodge had a candidate in waiting or not. Gwen and I both voted NO to both proposals. The proposal to delete the short Initiation passed. The proposal to require an Initiation ceremony at a DDGER visit did not pass. 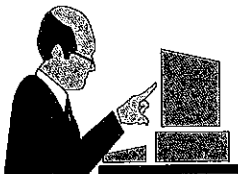

Once again, I would like to thank all the smokers for using the two big flower pots for your cigarette butts. I can tell the difference. There is a lot less cigarette butts on the ground.

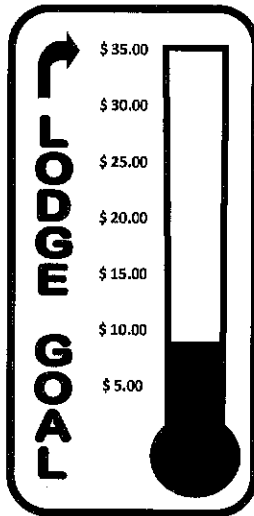

FROM THE AUDITING and ACCOUNTING COMMITTEE



During the first two weeks of July, 2017, the Committee audited the Board of Trustees, the Lodge Secretary and the Lodge Treasurer. The audit was conducted using the Checklists contained in the Grand Lodge Auditing & Accounting Manual.

Of the Board of Trustees we are concerned about the Lodge Relationship with the Condominium Association Piccadilly Walk/Spanish Village. Neither the Board or the Lodge possess a copy of the Association By-Laws or minutes of any Association Meetings. This year the fee was raised based on projected repairs to the parking areas and in 2015 the fee was raised for the same purpose but no repairs were made. This should have been established at an Association Meeting and a plan provided to all Association Members supporting the increase. Generally these actions are required by the Code of Virginia and the Trustees have been provided the applicable sections of that Code. Since the Lodge has no documentation available, it is unclear what the Lodge's position is; however, it is clear that the Parking area and sidewalks are in disrepair. The Board of Trustees must take action to resolve these issues. We recommend that if these issues cannot be resolved soon then outside legal assistance should be sought.

Of the Lodge Secretary and Treasurer no discrepancies were noted. In addition to the checklist items they collectively briefed the Committee on the day to day actions they take to insure that Lodge funds are accounted for and proper records are maintained. We found their efforts were sound and in the best interest of the Lodge.

Noted during the audit was the fact that seven keys to the Lodge are signed out to Members who have no functional need to have them. While the Secretary maintains the key control Log the Board of Trustees and the Exalted Ruler determines who has keys. This is a security and Insurance Issue. The list of people holding keys to the Lodge Building needs to be reviewed immediately and those holding keys without a valid reason should be directed to turn them in. Also, noted was that the security code to the ADT system has not been changed since it was installed. This must be updated.

The Lodge Financial Report to the Grand Lodge has been completed and with the Federal Tax return forwarded to the Grand Lodge. The Committee will report on the review of those at the August 16th Lodge Meeting.

FROM the MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

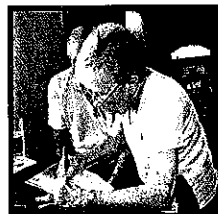

RECIPE of the MONTH

BEEF LOAF WITH DILL DRESSING

- 1 pound ground beef
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 3 cups soft bread crumbs
- ½ teaspoon celery salt
- 3 slices bacon
- ¼ cup minced onion
- ¼ cup chopped dill pickles
- ½ cup dill pickle juice
- 1 tablespoon melted butter



Mix meat and salt, roll between two sheets of waxed paper to rectangular shape, ¾ inch thick. Combine bread crumbs, celery salt, onions, pickles, juice and melted butter. Blend thoroughly and spread evenly over meat. Roll the meat with filling jelly roll fashion. Lay roll on a greased pan and arrange bacon over top. Bake 1 hour at 375 degrees.

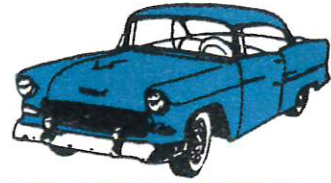
