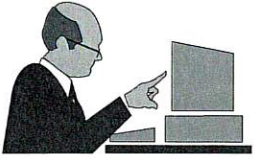

SECRETARY NOTES

Again; I will remind all Officers, Committee Chairs & Members in general that any correspondence generated concerning the Lodge or Lodge activities is the property of the Lodge and copies must be provided to the Secretary for filing. Also, any Correspondence on Lodge Letter Head must be prepared for the Exalted Ruler signature unless he otherwise approves.

At the Lodge Meeting on September 20, 2017 the Resignation of Paul Ferreira as Chairman and as a Member of the Board of Trustees was read on the floor and posted into the Lodge Minutes. At the Regular Scheduled Lodge Meeting to be held on October 4, 2017 nominations will be made and an election held to replace this Lodge Officer position.

Please take notice that our Lodge By-Laws and Home Club House Rules while having been amended have not been revised in over five years. It was noted during the DDGER visit that this needs to be done. The Exalted Ruler will appoint a By-Laws Coordinator who will be registered with the Grand Lodge to begin the process of updating the By-Laws in November.

On September 14, 2017 the Grand Lodge Insurance Contractor Representative conducted a review of the Lodge Property. The purpose of this review was to insure that the insurance coverage of the real and personal property is adequate. The results are that Real Property (the building) coverage is sufficient but Lodge Personal Property (contents) are grossly understated and under insured. The Secretary will provide the information to the Board of Trustees for review and corrective actions before their next scheduled meeting.

Please note: Any Meeting of a Lodge Functionary is generally open to all Lodge Members in good Standing. The Chairman of the Board of Trustees and Committee Chairs set their procedures for conducting their Meetings. Please abide by the procedures they have established.

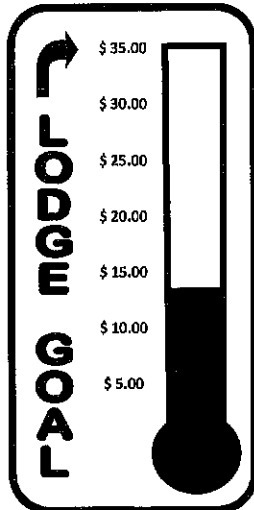

The Committee would like to thank everyone who came out for our "All You Can Eat" Breakfast Buffett on Sunday September 17th.

As some of you may know the Lodge has purchased a POS Management System. This system replaces the out of date and failing cash register in the Home Club because repair parts and maintenance services were no longer available. This new system besides functioning as a cash register also has management tools for inventory control and reporting and submission of required taxes. Also, paper tabs will no longer be used. The system should be up and operational on October 1st.

Additionally with the new system we will be accepting debit and credit cards (this function will be available in mid October). The Debit or Credit cards can ONLY be used for the purchase of FOOD & BEVERAGES. When using a card to pay you tab you can exceed the amount of the bill with cash back up to \$20.00 for the purpose of tipping your bartender or server, similar to what we currently have in our check cashing policy but you may do this only one time daily. Debit or Credit cards shall not be used to get cash to play Pull/Tabs. The ATM machine will remain in the Lodge for your convince. Please corporate, a bartender has no latitude in following these rules.

The check cashing policy as currently published remains in effect at this time but subject to review as necessary.

If you have any questions or concerns please use the Suggestion Box or attend a House Committee meeting, which is held on the 2nd and 4th Wednesday of each month.

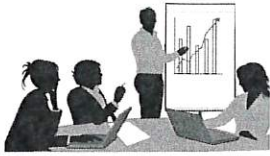

RECIPE of the MONTH

Salmon-and-Corn Mixed Grill

- 1 tablespoon ground caraway seeds
- ½ teaspoon ground white pepper
- Kosher salt
- 5 ears of corn, husked
- Vegetable oil, for brushing
- 1 stick unsalted butter, softened
- 2 tablespoons chopped dill
- One 2-pound, center-cut salmon fillet



Light a grill or preheat a grill pan. In a bowl, mix the caraway with the white pepper and 1 tablespoon of kosher salt. Brush the corn with oil and grill over high heat, turning, until lightly charred, 5 minutes. Wrap 4 ears in foil to keep warm. Cut the kernels from the remaining cob and transfer to a mini food processor. Let cool slightly. Add the butter, dill and 1 tablespoon of the caraway salt and pulse until blended. Scrape the butter into a bowl; refrigerate for 5 minutes. Brush the salmon all over with oil and rub with the remaining caraway salt. Grill the salmon skin side down until the skin is browned and crisp, 4 minutes. Turn the salmon and grill until almost cooked through, 4 minutes longer. Top the salmon with the compound butter and serve with the corn.
