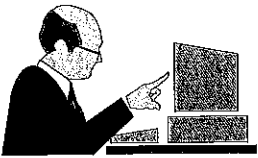

Something for Members to remember: You shall not bring any container of an alcoholic beverage that is not available for sale in a Virginia ABC Retail Store into the Lodge; that means no homemade beer, wine, or other

bottled beverages containing alcohol. Also, all mixed drinks, beer and wine must be served by a bartender posted as a server on duty and fees for that service collected. Members shall not have bottles containing alcohol on a table or in any area of the Lodge outside of the bartenders control. This policy is not a Lodge rule, but State of Virginia Law and ABC regulations. Please do not by your individual actions put our Lodge in jeopardy of losing our License and our ability to have all Members enjoy having a beverage in our Lodge! If you do not like these rules contact your State Representative and ask him or her to change the Law!!

During the Summer months (May-August) the House Committee Meeting will be held on the 2nd & 4th Tuesday of the month. In September we will go back to the 2nd & 4th Wednesday of the month.

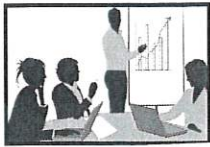

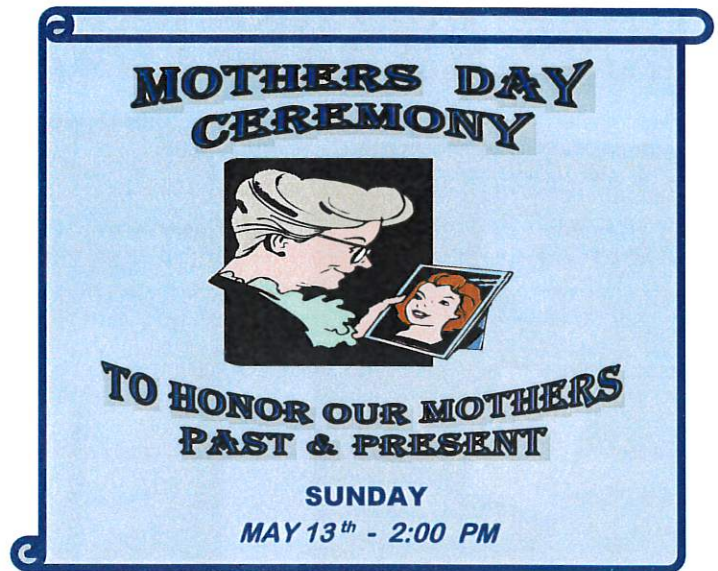

Come and Have a Good Time, But Please, Take A Moment To Remember Those Military Members That Died For Our Country.



It's easy to forget what Memorial Day actually means while you're sitting by the pool and looking ahead at summer vacation - but the day signifies much more than just a three-day weekend.

Memorial Day is a solemn day of remembrance for everyone who has died serving in the American Armed Forces. The holiday, originally known as Decoration Day, started after the Civil War to honor the Union and Confederate dead.

In the years following the Civil War, Memorial Day celebrations were scattered and, perhaps unsurprisingly, took root differently in the North and South. It wasn't until after World War II that the holiday gained a strong following and national identity, and it wasn't officially named Memorial Day until 1967.

The final event that cemented the modern culture of Memorial Day in America was in 1968 when Congress passed the Uniform Holiday Act, designating Memorial Day as the last Monday in May rather than May 30, as it had previously been observed.

DID YOU KNOW

Our Lodge Owns a Cemetery for Members !

The impressive statue of the big Elk is quite visible as you enter the beautiful Green Lawn Memorial Park Cemetery in Newport News from the North Gate. The life size bronze Elk maintains his alert stance and vigil from a sturdy, masonry and granite base seven feet tall. From the ground to the tip of his antlers is over sixteen feet. His imposing monument is engraved with large, bold letters, which sets forth the identifying words:

“ELKS REST”



The statuesque Elk faces South and overlooks a multitude of granite memorials of those who are now engaged in perpetual sleep in this peaceful cemetery. He seems to be standing guard over our fallen Fraternity Brothers who rest in the soil below his massive platform. There are 35 deceased Lodge Members of BPOE Lodge # 315 interred in this spacious, rectangular area, measuring approximately 85 feet by 130 feet with a granite and bronze border. According to the headstones which bear the Members date of Initiation into the Lodge and their date of death shows there have been no burials here since 1976. The first interment was in 1925. Adequate space is available in this area, (approximately 180 unused grave sites) and the area is owned by our Lodge. Any member of Lodge 315 can request to be buried here with no fee to the Lodge. Contact the Lodge Secretary for more information.

The North end of the monument is inscribed:

*“The faults of our Brothers we write upon the sand.
The virtues upon the tablets of love and memory.”*

The South end of the monument is inscribed:

*“Dedicated to the memory of our departed Brothers by Newport News,
Virginia Lodge 315 BPOE, 1921.”*

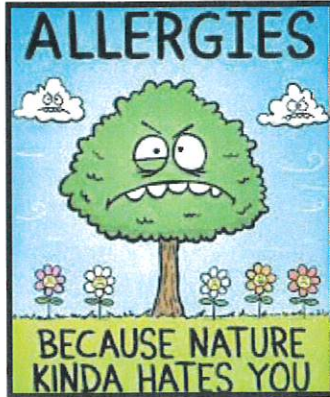
Zoe A. Andrews, daughter of Member Zalph Andrews, III and Granddaughter of Zalph Andrews, Jr. (our Lodge Secretary) & Member Vicki Andrews has received an Elks National Foundation Legacy Scholarship. Only four were awarded in the State of Virginia and each is valued at \$4,000.00.

Newport News Elks Lodge 315 received 29 applications for the ENF Most Valuable Scholarships this year. After Lodge review 16 were submitted (eight boys and eight girls) to District Level Judging. They in turn selected three boys and three girls to advance to State Judging. Of the six sent to State three applicants were from our Lodge. They were Zachary Ruhlen, Alex Lee and Maaya Prasad. Two of our three Zachary and Maaya were awarded a scholarship at the State Level.

There was an award presentation on Sunday, April 22nd for the three students that went to State competition from our Lodge. A Certificate and Scholarship check (funded by our Lodge) for \$1000.00 was presented to each of those three students (see the pictures above). In addition we had a ENF Legacy Scholarship award winner from our Lodge.

RECIPE of the MONTH
Classic Chicken Pot Pie

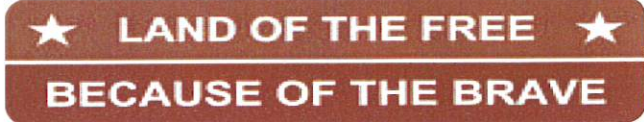


- ¼ cup butter
- ¼ cup all-purpose flour
- ¼ cup chopped onion
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon pepper
- 1¾ cups chicken broth
- ¾ cup milk
- 3 cups cut-up cooked chicken or turkey
- 1 box (10 oz) frozen peas and carrots
- 1 package (15 oz) refrigerated pie crusts, softened as directed on box

In 2-quart saucepan, melt butter over medium heat. Stir in flour, onion, salt and pepper. Cook, stirring constantly, until mixture is bubbly; remove from heat. Stir in broth and milk. Heat to boiling, stirring constantly. Boil and stir 1 minute. Stir in chicken and peas and carrots; remove from heat. Heat oven to 425°F. Roll 1 pie crust into 13-inch square. Ease into ungreased 9-inch (2-quart) glass baking dish. Pour chicken mixture into crust-lined dish. Roll remaining pie crust into 11-inch square. Cut out designs with 1-inch cookie cutter. Place square over chicken mixture. Arrange cutouts on top crust. Turn edges of pie crust under; flute edge. Bake about 35 minutes or until golden brown.
