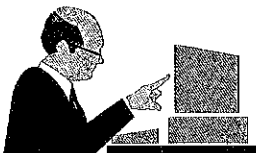

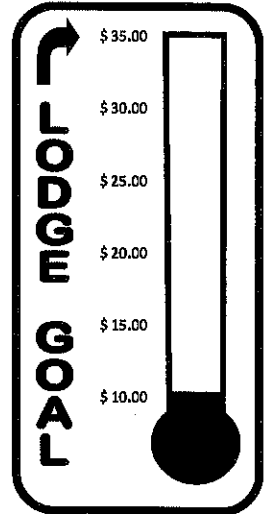
FROM the ELKS NATION FOUNDATION COMMITTEE

out to us several items that we now must comply with. First, is that all Lodge Officers must submit a form provided by him so the State can do a background check on them. Secondly, we must report in advance to him of any activity held in the Lodge that is not a normal day to day activity such as the Breast Cancer Fund Raising Dinner or a Memorial Day Picnic. The Lodge Secretary intends to meet this requirement by Emailing him a copy of our Monthly Lodge Calendar.

The issue of the "Poker Player Group" came up. In an Email from the agent, Donald.Borst@abc.virginia.gov, is quoted below and is the ABC policy concerning this.

"I have reviewed the poker game question and have an answer for you. As long as the activity has been sanctioned by the Charitable Gaming Commission and you have documentation supporting that approval, the poker game would not be in violation of ABC Laws or Regulations. Any other gaming or gambling activity would fall into the category of illegal Gambling and as such would be a violation".

RECIPE of the MONTH

TOASTED ALMOND PASTA SALAD

- ½ cup sliced almonds
- Kosher salt
- 1 ¾ cups ditalini pasta (about 10 ounces)
- ¼ cup extra-virgin olive oil
- ¼ cup grated parmesan cheese
- 2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice
- 1 small shallot, finely chopped
- 1 tablespoon fresh thyme (preferably lemon thyme), roughly chopped
- Freshly ground pepper
- Pinch of red pepper flakes



Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Spread the almonds on a rimmed baking sheet and bake, tossing occasionally, until golden brown, 8 to 10 minutes. Meanwhile, bring a pot of salted water to a boil. Add the pasta and cook as the label directs, then drain and rinse under cold water. Transfer to a serving bowl and toss with the olive oil, parmesan, lemon juice, shallot, thyme, 1 teaspoon salt and about half of the almonds. Season with salt and pepper. Top with the remaining almonds and the red pepper flakes.
