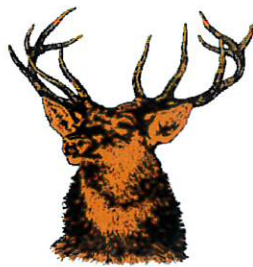

### FROM THE EXALTED RULER



#### To all ELKS of the Lodge

I will start off by saying that between June 30<sup>th</sup> and July 4<sup>th</sup> I attended and represented our Lodge at the Grand Lodge Annual Session (Convention) in San Antonio, Texas. As this was the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the founding of our Order of Elks the pomp and ceremony and business sessions were spectacular. Over 8,000 Elks from our over 1,800 lodges attended. Our Virginia Elks Association was well represented and our VEA hospitality room was great. At the session this year changes and amendments to the Grand Lodge Statutes were presented and voted on. Of the 15 issues that I voted on only two would have directly affected the operation of our Lodge. I voted no to require the Officers of the Lodge to perform the initiation ritual during the official visit of the District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler. I voted yes to allow Lodges to amend their By-Laws to provide for a different rate of dues for married couples residing at the same address. Both Motions failed. Most of the other proposed changes concerned Lodges who are incorporated in their state or operate adjunct operations none of which apply to our Lodge. All other Issues presented and results passed or failed are available to Members on request to the Lodge Secretary and will be posted on the Official Lodge Bulletin Board.

Also, at the session Paul Dacyczyn was installed as the Virginia Southeastern District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler (DDGER). We are in his District. He will also conduct the annual DDGER visit an audit of our Lodge in October.



Another big issue discussed at the Grand Lodge Session was the steadily increasing cost of the Grand Lodge liability insurance program that passes to local lodges as part of the annual assessment from the Grand Lodge. These recent increases are mostly because of alcohol related accidents involving Elks leaving a lodge and becoming involved in an accident while alcohol impaired and resulting in a law suit against a lodge. The Policy In Our Lodge is when the bartender suspects or knows that a member is alcohol impaired you will (and any guests with you) will be told to leave. Failure to comply or argue with this policy **SHALL** result in a suspension of your Home Club privileges.

As most of you know August will be a slow month as far as Lodge activities are concerned. In July we had the Independence Day (4<sup>th</sup> of July) picnic and it was a lot of fun. Thanks to all who contributed and attended. In August the big event will be the "Membership Appreciation Day" on Saturday the 18<sup>th</sup>. The House Committee will sponsor this and the are working

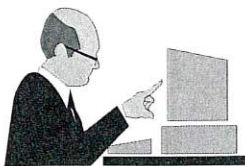

Each member attending is given a written handout of current bills against the Lodge when entering. Also, these are posted on the "Official Lodge Bulletin Board" (by the side door on the side of the steps leading upstairs) before the Meeting. During the Lodge Meeting the bills are presented to the Membership and a vote is taken to approve payment. Any new obligation to the Lodge not included in the member approved Lodge Budget (and with Trustee approval) must be presented under New Business and approved by Lodge members before a payment can be made. A schedule of reoccurring bills such as utilities, insurance, taxes, fees & maintenance requirements are also posted on the "Official Board". If you have any concerns about our Lodge expenses your questions will probably be answered if you attend a Lodge Meeting!



The Veterans Committee did not have a meeting in the month of July. Our next scheduled meeting will be August 7<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 PM.

During the yard sale & bake sale in June the Veterans Committee raised about \$270. That is amazing. Again thank you all for all the items donated and all the hard baking that was done.

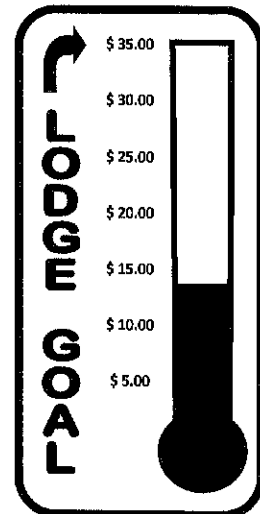

## YOUTH ACTIVITY COMMITTEE REPORT



The Lodge Youth Activities Committee has three major programs in the Lodge annually. The first is the VEA Youth Camp. During July we sponsored four girls and three boys who attended the Camp.

For information to newer Members of our Lodge the camp is a major project of the Virginia Elks Association. The 137 acre property is located in Millboro, VA (north of Clifton Forge) on the Cowpasture River, in the beautiful mountains of the Alleghenies. Boys and girls between the ages of 8 to 13 are eligible to attend. The programs prepared for the youth include: arts & crafts, land sports, court play, water, nature awareness activities plus group games & team building events. Some of the special events include: On Monday and Wednesday, campers hike to the bluffs and inner tube down the river. Tuesday is Land Olympics Day while Thursday is Water Olympics Day. Special night activities are planned for each evening. Some of the night activities are: Campfires, Staff Hunt, Candy Carnival, Free Courts & an Awards Ceremony.

This year the Committee selected kids to sponsor who were identified as from a parent or family in economic situations where the children would have never had an opportunity to experience the type of activities offered at the Youth Camp.

The Committee is very grateful for the fund raising support we received from many sources including: donors responding to Facebook postings, Lodge members, internet proceeds and donations from business in our community and TUTT internet radio listeners (the station is operated by Member Barbara McDonald's husband Jimmy McDonald). We were able to provide clothing, sleeping bags, bathing suits, and other summer clothing for the youth we sponsored that they needed and their parents could not afford to purchase. This effort allowed them to attend and participate fully as a camper.

On Page 7 of this Newsletter are pictures of our kids at Camp. You can tell by the happy faces how much they appreciated our efforts to send them. Again thanks to all who supported and contributed to help. Hopefully having an great week of fun at our Elks Youth Camp might help to make a difference in a young persons attitude on life and their future.

The next Project of the Committee will be its "BACK TO SCHOOL" time Program. This year we will be collecting items for kids who are in need of school supplies. Items needed are, #2 pencils, colored pencils, crayons, glue sticks, composition books, tissues, hand sanitizer, yellow highlighters, wide rule paper, Index cards, mechanical pencils, dry erase markers and 2 inch binders. There will be a box around the bar area where you can place your items. If you would like to just make a monetary donation that will be fine too. So when your out shopping pick up a few items on the above list because every donation will be

appreciated! We will need the items by August 23<sup>rd</sup>. The Committee will purchase back packs to put the supplies for the young students in!

In December we will sponsor the "Angel Tree" and breakfast with "Santa" for needy children in our community. In the October Lodge Newsletter we will outline the proposed program and announce the help we will need. Again "THANK YOU" to all who helped make a few needy kids summer a "Happy Time"

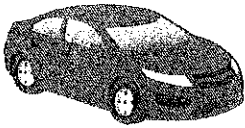

### RECIPE of the MONTH

#### Stuffed Tomatoes

Looking for a recipe with tomatoes? These simple stuffed tomatoes are perfect for weeknights or having friends over, as it can be prepared up to 24 hours in advance. Filled with an herby rice stuffing, they make a great starter or light supper when served with a side salad.

- 6 large ripe tomatoes
- 1/3 cup long-grain rice, uncooked
- 1 clove garlic, chopped
- 2 tbsp basil, chopped
- 2 tbsp mint, chopped
- 2 tbsp flat-leaf parsley, chopped
- 1 tbsp thyme leaves, chopped
- Grated zest 1 lemon
- 3 tbsp olive oil



Heat the oven to 350° F. Slice the tops off the tomatoes and set them aside. (These will serve as 'lids'.) Using a teaspoon, scoop out the pulp and juices and place in a bowl. Add all the rest of the ingredients to the bowl, season well and mix thoroughly. Spoon the mixture into the tomatoes and place in a small roasting tin (large enough to hold them in a single layer). Top each tomato with its 'lid'. Bake for 35 minutes, or until tender.
