TREASURES REPORT



Below is the status of Lodge Finances reported at the Regular Scheduled Meeting held on April 19, 2023.

CASH on HAND in the Lodge Working Checking Account at Old Point National Bank is \$80,114.96.

SAVINGS ACCOUNT - *interest bearing* at Langley Federal Credit Union is \$43,252.00.

INVESTMENT ACCOUNTS (*Certificates of Deposits & interest bearing accounts*) held at Old Point National Bank & Langley Federal Credit Union is \$213,437.10.

GAMING ACCOUNTS for gaming machines earnings is \$28,095.72.

TOTAL OF BALANCES ON HAND reported at the Lodge Meeting was \$364,899.78.

The Lodge building is paid for & valued and insured for at \$625,000.00. Personal property (contents of the building) contained within is valued and insured at \$198,000.00. The Lodge has NO debts other than the reoccurring monthly, quarterly and annual operational expenses.

A list of the regular Lodge operational bills and costs are posted on the Official Lodge Bulletin (Notice) Board. The monthly or currently due charges from that list are paid when due under the Lodge By-Laws and are presented to

Members at each Regular Scheduled Lodge Meeting to review and approve payment actions.

Member Christine Ratliff's Mother is in Riverside recovering from Pneumonia.

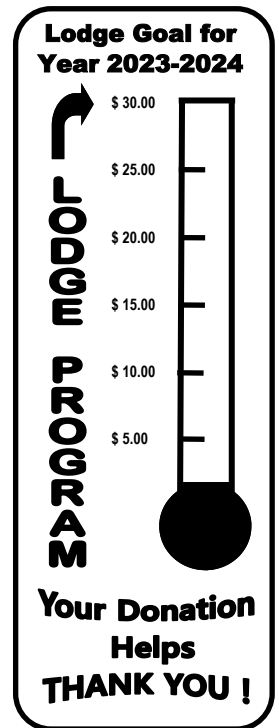
Member Scarlett Hillard is to receive fifteen radiation treatments for a spot on her lung.

LODGE ADOPT-A-SPOT PROGRAM



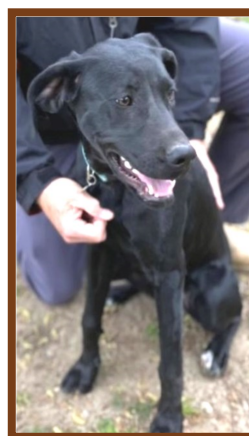

RECIPE of the MONTH

ENCRUSTED FLOUNDER

- 2 pounds flounder fillets
- 1 cup all purpose flour
- 2 large eggs
- 1 cup milk
- 1/2 cup canola oil
- 3 cups crumbled potato chips



Place flour in a shallow container. Beat eggs and milk together in another shallow container. Place potato chips in a third shallow container. Dredge fillets in flour, then dip in egg mix-ture. Place fillets in potato chips and press into both sides. Place oil in a large sauté pan over medium heat. Add flounder and cook until golden brown on both sides. Finish in 350 degree oven for 6 to 7 minutes. Serve immediately. Serves 4.
