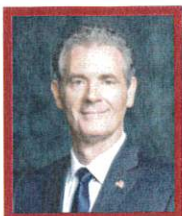
Holiday Baskets, Veteran Ditty Bags and a donation to the "Fives Loaves of Bread Pantry".

This year the Foundation has allocated \$16.3 million for Lodge Community Service Grants. This grant program allows our Lodges to do more for your communities. I encourage all Lodges to seriously consider forming an ENF committee to educate themselves on the various grants to assist their communities.

Also, make use of the fundraising program through the ENF Fidelity Club. Any Member can sign up at elks.org to make the automatic recurring donations for as little as \$5 per month or \$15 per quarter. I encourage you to consider joining. I felt good when I joined and knew that it was an easy and efficient way to donate. This is once again a way for you to show your communities that "Elks Care — Elks Share."

Below is the status of Lodge Finances reported at the Regular Scheduled Meeting held on September 18, 2024.

CASH ON HAND in the Lodge Working Checking Account at Old Point National Bank is \$39,424.18.

SAVINGS ACCOUNT - interest bearing at Langley Federal Credit Union is \$37,780.01.

INVESTMENT ACCOUNTS (Certificates of Deposits & interest bearing accounts) held at Old Point National Bank & Langley Federal Credit Union is \$245,535.21.

GAMING ACCOUNTS for gaming machines earnings is \$11,401.63.

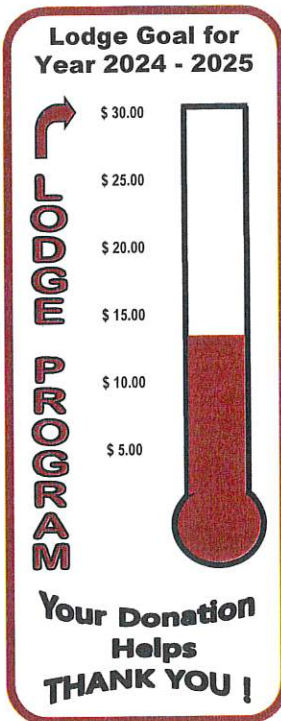

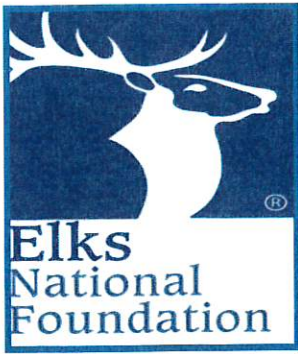

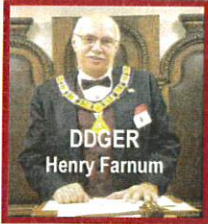

REPICE of the MONTH

Sweet Potato & Black Bean Chili



- 1 tablespoon plus
- 2 teaspoons olive oil
- 1 medium sweet potato, peeled and diced
- 1 large onion, diced
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 tablespoons chili powder

- 4 teaspoons ground cumin
- ½ teaspoon ground chipotle
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- 2 ½ cups water
- 2 (15 ounce) cans black beans
- 1 (14 ounce) can diced tomatoes
- 4 teaspoons lime juice
- 1 cup chopped fresh cilantro

Heat oil in a Dutch oven over medium-high heat. Add sweet potato and onion and cook, stirring often, until the onion is beginning to soften, about 4 minutes. Add garlic, chili powder, cumin, chipotle and salt and cook, stirring constantly, for 30 seconds. Add water and bring to a simmer. Cover, reduce heat to maintain a gentle simmer and cook until the sweet potato is tender, 10 to 12 minutes.

Add beans, tomatoes and lime juice; increase heat to high and return to a simmer, stirring often. Reduce heat and simmer until slightly reduced, about 5 minutes. Remove from heat and stir in cilantro.

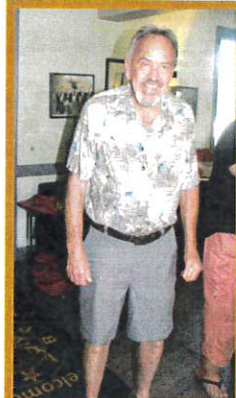

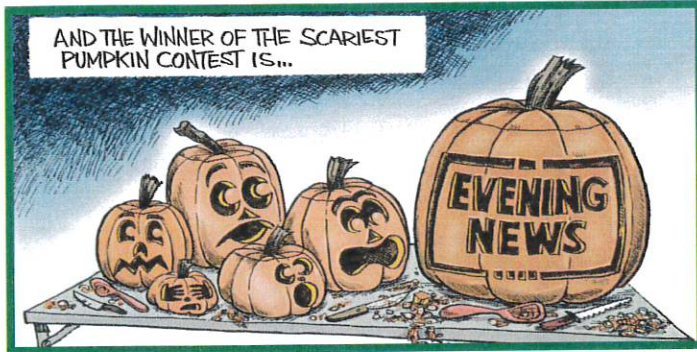
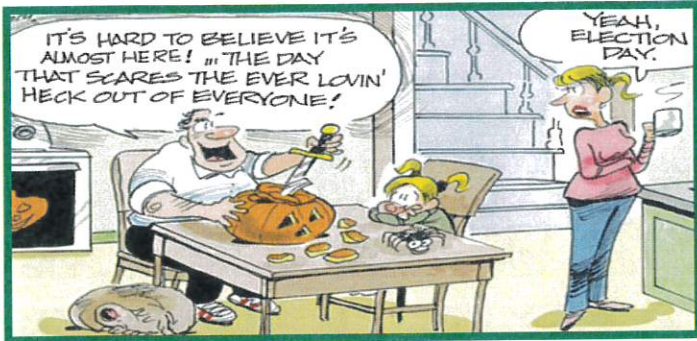
