LODGE SECRETARY NOTES

November makes the beginning of the 8th Month of this Lodge Year.

The Holiday Season will be in full swing shortly so be on the lookout for news regarding events, dinners, and charity drives.

The Lodge Membership tally has been updated. For this Lodge year 16 new Candidates have been Initiated, along with two Reinstatements. As of this writing, Membership stands at 140, with an additional seven going through the processes until they are initiated.

Per our Lodge By-Laws, those Members who were delinquent in their annual dues were dropped from the active Membership on November 1st. A former Member can be reinstated if they are nominated by a current Member and payment of a reinstatement fee (\$25.00) and the remittance of the Annual Dues. Currently, the Lodge has dropped 13 Members for nonpayment of Annual Dues.

DDGER and Lodge Member Henry Farnum has discussed the *Elks Rest Program* at the Greenlawn Cemetery in Newport News. He stated it was a separate section with approximately 35 past Lodge Members interned there. The area has not been taken care of to the standards of the Elks and some maintenance is needed. Maintenance includes some ground clearing and some headstone and gravesite cleaning. He will have a Meeting on November 6th at 6:00 PM with any interested Members to discuss plans for maintenance and to honor our Past Members.

If you are interested in assisting with the *Lodge Elks Rest Program*, please attend the Meeting at the Lodge for more information regarding this program.

Below is the status of Lodge Finances reported at the Regular Scheduled Meeting held on October 16, 2024.

CASH ON HAND in the Lodge Working Checking Account at Old Point National Bank is \$40,460.90.

SAVINGS ACCOUNT - interest bearing at Langley Federal Credit Union is \$37,781.57.

INVESTMENT ACCOUNTS (Certificates of Deposits & interest bearing accounts) held at Old Point National Bank & Langley Federal Credit Union is \$246,219.50.

TOTAL OF BALANCES ON HAND reported at the Lodge Meeting was \$313,216.70.

The Lodge Building and Contents are paid for. The Lodge has NO debts other than the reoccurring monthly, quarterly and annual operational expenses.

A list of the regular Lodge Operational Bills are posted on the Official Lodge Bulletin (NOTICE) Board. The monthly or currently due charges from that list are paid when due under the By-Laws and are presented to Members at each Regular Scheduled Lodge Meeting to review and approve the payments.

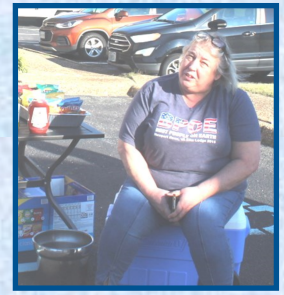

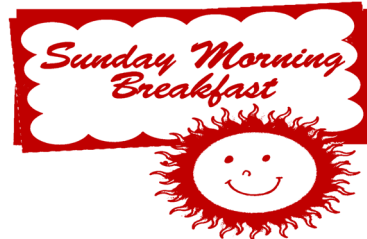
REPICE of the MONTH

Best Ever Stuffed Mushrooms

- 1 pound bulk pork sausage
- 1/4 cup finely chopped onion
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 1 package (8 ounces) reduced-fat cream cheese
- 1/4 cup shredded Parmesan cheese
- 1/3 cup seasoned bread crumbs
- 3 teaspoons dried basil
- 1-1/2 teaspoons dried parsley flakes
- 30 large fresh mushrooms (about 1-1/2 pounds), stems removed
- 3 tablespoons butter, melted



Preheat oven to 400°. In a large skillet, cook sausage, onion and garlic over medium heat, breaking up sausage into crumbles, until meat is no longer pink and onion is tender, 6-8 minutes; drain. Add cream cheese and Parmesan cheese; cook and stir until melted. Stir in bread crumbs, basil and parsley. Meanwhile, place mushroom caps in a greased 15x10x1-in. baking pan, bottom side up. Brush with melted butter. Spoon sausage mixture into mushroom caps. Bake, uncovered, until mushrooms are tender, 12-15 minutes.

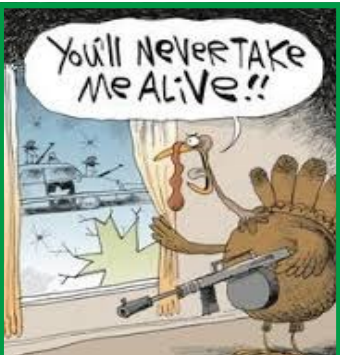

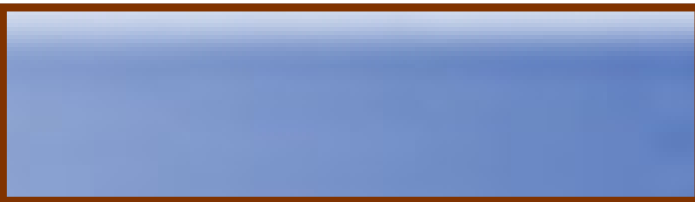
