Dues for the fiscal year 2025-2026 will be mailed in the coming month. If you do not receive a statement, please make sure the Lodge has your current mailing address.

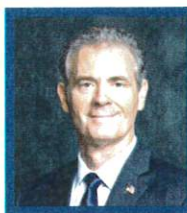

Below is the status of Lodge Finances reported at the Regular Scheduled Meeting held on November 20, 2024.

CASH ON HAND in the Lodge Working Checking Account at Old Point National Bank is 23,015.95.

SAVINGS ACCOUNT at Langley Federal Credit Union is \$37,783.18.

INVESTMENT ACCOUNTS (Certificates of Deposits) held at Old Point National Bank & Langley Federal Credit Union is \$247,101.94.

GAMING ACCOUNT BALANCE is \$11,200.09.

TOTAL OF BALANCES ON HAND reported at the Lodge Meeting was \$319,101.16.

## REPICE of the MONTH

### " 5 TO 6 POUND BEEF BRISKET "

#### DRY RUB

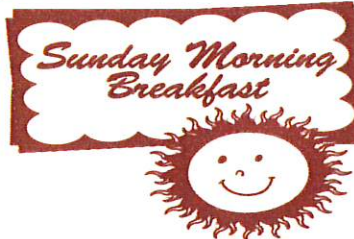
- ¼ cup paprika
- 3 tablespoons maple sugar
- 2 tablespoons kosher salt
- 2 tablespoons garlic powder
- 1 tablespoon black pepper
- 1 tablespoon onion powder
- 1 teaspoon cumin
- 1 teaspoon cayenne pepper



#### ROASTING LIQUID

- ¼ cup black coffee
- 2 tablespoons blackstrap molasses
- 2 tablespoons apple cider vinegar
- 2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce

Preheat your oven to 250°F. Liberally apply the dry rub on both sides of the thawed brisket at room temperature. Mix roasting liquid. Whisk all of the liquid ingredients together and pour into a roasting pan. Add the brisket to the pan and cover tightly with aluminum foil. Cook for about 6 hours or until an instant read thermometer reaches 195°F to 200°F. Remove the brisket from the oven and let it rest for 30 minutes before slicing. Then, slice against the grain for the most tender pieces.
